AN ACT

To amend chapter 160, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to reports of community and school safety concerns.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 160, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 160.269, to read as follows:

160.269. 1. As used in this section, "state reporting tool" means a safe, anonymous, and confidential reporting mechanism provided by the Missouri state highway patrol, such as the Courage2Report Missouri reporting mechanism or a successor reporting mechanism, to enable concerned parents, students, school employees, citizens, and reporters to submit real-time reports of community and school safety concerns of such concerned individuals or others involving any:

- 7 (1) Bullying or repeated harassment;
- 8 (2) Cyberbullying;
- 9 (3) Fighting;
- 10 **(4) Gun**;
- 11 (5) Homicide;
- 12 (6) Human trafficking;
- 13 (7) Imminent school shooting;
- 14 **(8)** Knife;
- 15 (9) Physical assault;
- 16 (10) Planned school attack;
- 17 (11) School shooting threat;

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

18 (12) Sexual offense;

- 19 (13) Suicide of another individual;
- 20 (14) Terrorism threat or extremism; or
- 21 (15) Other community or school safety concern.
 - 2. (1) School districts, charter schools, and law enforcement agencies that receive a community or school safety concern submitted through a state reporting tool shall notify the Missouri state highway patrol how the school district, charter school, or law enforcement agency received, responded to, and resolved the submitted concern. Such notification shall be submitted within fifteen calendar days of the receipt of the submitted concern and, if such concern does not have a final resolution within such fifteen days, every thirty calendar days after until the final resolution of such concern.
 - (2) The notification submitted to the Missouri state highway patrol shall describe whether the submitted concern required an action to resolve the concern, whether such concern required a proceeding within the criminal justice system or juvenile justice system, steps taken to resolve the submitted concern, the names of individuals or entities involved in resolving the submitted concern, and the final resolution of the concern. If a notification is submitted before the final resolution of a submitted concern, such notification shall contain as much of the information required in this subdivision as is available at the time such notification is submitted. Upon the final resolution of the submitted concern, such notification shall contain all information required in this subdivision.
 - 3. Before February first of each year, the Missouri state highway patrol shall compile a list of each notification made under subsection 2 of this section in the previous calendar year and submit such list to each chamber of the general assembly. Such list shall be compiled and formatted in a way that allows any individual viewing such list to see how many concerns were submitted through the state reporting tool, where such submitted concerns originated, percentages of total concerns submitted in each school district or charter school, how many submitted concerns required an action to resolve the concern, how many submitted concerns required no action to resolve the concern, whether each of such submitted concerns required a proceeding within the criminal justice system or juvenile justice system, steps taken to resolve the submitted concerns, the names of entities involved in resolving the submitted concerns, and the final resolution of each submitted concern.
 - 4. No data related to the list compiled under subsection 3 of this section shall be disclosed in any form that allows the personal identification of any individual who
