AN ACT

To repeal sections 226.030 and 226.120, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to the highways and transportation commission.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 226.030 and 226.120, RSMo, are repealed and two new sections 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 226.030 and 226.120, to read as follows:

226.030. 1. Prior to January 1, 2017, the highways and transportation commission 2 shall consist of six members, who shall be appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and 3 consent of the senate, not more than three thereof to be members of the same political party. Beginning January 1, 2017, the commission shall consist of eight members who shall be 4 appointed by the governor by and with the advice and consent of the senate, not more than 5 four thereof to be members of the same political party, with one commissioner appointed 6 from each of the state's seven department of transportation geographic districts and one 7 8 commissioner appointed regardless of where he or she resides. Each commissioner shall be a taxpayer and resident of state for at least five years prior to his or her appointment. Any 9 10 commissioner may be removed by the governor if fully satisfied of his or her inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct in office. Commissioners appointed pursuant to this section shall 11 12 be appointed for terms of six years, except as otherwise provided in this subsection. Upon the expiration of each of the foregoing terms of these commissioners a successor shall be appointed 13 for a term of six years or until his or her successor is appointed and qualified which term of six 14 15 years shall thereafter be the length of term of each member of the commission unless removed as above provided. The members of the commission shall receive as compensation for their 16 17 services twenty-five dollars per day for the time spent in the performance of their official duties,

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18 and also their necessary traveling and other expenses incurred while actually engaged in the

discharge of their official duties. [Members whose terms otherwise expire December 1, 2003, 19 20 shall serve with terms expiring March 1, 2004, and new members or the members reappointed shall be appointed for terms expiring March 1, 2005; a member whose term otherwise expires 21 22 December 1, 2005, shall serve with a term expiring March 1, 2007; a member whose term 23 otherwise expires December 1, 2007, shall serve with a term expiring March 1, 2009; and one 24 member whose term otherwise expires October 13, 2007, shall serve with a term expiring March 25 1, 2007; and one member whose term otherwise expires October 13, 2007, shall serve with a 26 term expiring March 1, 2009.] If a vacancy occurs in any term of a commissioner due to death, 27 resignation, or removal, a successor shall be appointed for only the remainder of the unexpired 28 term.

29 2. The two members of the commission, one each from opposing political parties, who 30 have the most seniority in commission service shall serve as commission leadership with one 31 member as chair and the other member as vice chair, respectively, for terms ending March 1, 32 2005. The commission shall elect one of the members as chair and the other as vice chair. 33 Effective March 1, 2005, the commission shall elect the two members of the commission, one from each opposing political party who has the most seniority in commission service, who shall 34 serve as commission leadership with one member as chair and the other member as vice chair, 35 36 respectively, for one year. At the end of such year, the members currently serving as chair and 37 vice chair shall have the option to rotate positions, and the member currently serving as vice 38 chair may serve as chair, and vice versa. Thereafter, commission leadership shall continue to 39 rotate accordingly with the two members from opposing political parties who have the most 40 seniority in terms of commission service being elected by the commission to serve as 41 commission leadership. If one of the commission leadership offices becomes vacant due to death, resignation, removal, or [refuses] refusal to serve before the one-year leadership term 42 expires, the commission shall elect one of its members that is of the same political party as the 43 44 vacating officer to serve the remainder of the vacating officer's leadership term. Such election shall not prohibit that member from later serving as chair and vice chair when such member's 45 seniority in commission service qualifies him or her for those offices as provided in this 46 47 subsection. Any member reappointed shall be eligible to serve as chair or vice-chair only 48 during the final two years of such member's reappointment.

3. No more than one-half of the members of the commission shall be of the same
political party. The selection and removal of all employees of the department of transportation
shall be without regard to political affiliation.

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4. The present members of the commission shall continue to serve as members of the commission for the remainder of the terms for which they were appointed, except as provided in subsection 1 of this section.

55 [5. Any member reappointed shall only be eligible to serve as chair or vice-chair during 56 the final two years of such member's reappointment.]

226.120. The members of the commission shall elect a member as chairman and another vice chairman, each of whom shall hold such office for a term prescribed by the commission. [Four] A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and for the exercise of any of the powers or the discharge of any of the duties authorized or imposed by law. The commission shall meet at least once each month and at such other times, and at such places within the state, as the commission shall determine. The chairman or, in the event of his inability to act, the vice chairman may call special meetings of the commission upon notice to members.

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
