## AN ACT

To amend chapter 650, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the establishment of a task force on police officer presence in schools and communities.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 650, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 650.465, to read as follows:

650.465. 1. There is hereby established in the department of public safety a "Task Force on Police Officer Presence in Schools and Communities" to increase positive social 2 interaction between youth and law enforcement officers and to develop a harmonious 3 rapport between the two entities. The task force shall focus its efforts on establishing 4 programs, projects, activities, and events in communities located in a county with a charter 5 form of government and with more than nine hundred fifty thousand inhabitants that 6 contain school districts with a total minority student population that exceeds fifty percent. 7 8 2. The task force shall have a membership of nine persons appointed by the director of the department of public safety. Membership may include, but not be limited 9 10 to, representatives of the following groups:

11 (1) Licensed attorneys with experience in criminal defense who are in no way 12 involved in prosecuting crimes;

- 13 (2) Civic organizations;
- 14 (3) Community-based organizations;
- 15 (4) Community education organizations;
- 16 **(5)** Local government;
- 17 **(6)** Local police organizations;

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EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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18 (7) School boards; and

19 **(8)** Teachers.

3. The director of the department of public safety or the director's designee shall convene the first meeting of the task force for the purpose of establishing bylaws and electing officers to include a chairperson, vice chairperson, and secretary. The task force shall not meet more than four times annually. Members may be reimbursed for expenses but shall not receive a per diem allowance.

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## 4. The task force shall:

(1) Conduct studies on local, statewide, and national programs with demonstrated
 success at increasing positive social relationships with law enforcement agencies and youth;

(2) Make recommendations to law enforcement agencies, communities, and schools
 as to programs, projects, activities, and events that will aid in developing a harmonious
 rapport between law enforcement officers and youth;

31 (3) Advise the commissioner of education and the department of education on issues 32 relating to the establishment of community relations programs in communities located in 33 a county with a charter form of government and with more than nine hundred fifty 34 thousand inhabitants that contain school districts with a total minority student population 35 that exceeds fifty percent;

(4) Make recommendations for a state plan for community education that sets forth
 the goals and objectives of a community relations program and establishes a system of
 priorities for targeting available resources on the areas with the greatest need within a
 school district;

40 (5) Make recommendations for establishing community schools within communities
 41 containing community relations programs; and

42 (6) Make recommendations for the funding of local community relations programs
43 and projects, activities, and events that will aid in developing a harmonious rapport
44 between law enforcement officers and youth.

5. For purposes of subsection 4 of this section, "community school", means a school that makes its facilities available for citizen use, coordinates activities of local citizens in identifying program needs and establishing priorities, identifies and utilizes available program resources, and assists in the initiation of programs to improve the cultural, social, recreational, and educational opportunities available in a community.

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
