AN ACT

To repeal section 575.095, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to tampering with a judicial officer, with a penalty provision.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

- Section A. Section 575.095, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 575.095, to read as follows:
- 575.095. 1. A person commits the offense of tampering with a judicial officer if, with 2 the purpose to harass, intimidate or influence a judicial officer in the performance of such 3 officer's official duties, such person:
- 4 (1) Threatens or causes harm to such judicial officer or members of such judicial officer's family;
- 6 (2) Uses force, threats, or deception against or toward such judicial officer or members 7 of such judicial officer's family;
 - (3) Offers, conveys or agrees to convey any benefit direct or indirect upon such judicial officer or such judicial officer's family;
- 10 (4) Engages in conduct reasonably calculated to harass or alarm such judicial officer or 11 such judicial officer's family, including stalking pursuant to section 565.225 or 565.227.
- 2. A judicial officer for purposes of this section shall be a judge, arbitrator, special master, juvenile officer, deputy juvenile officer, state prosecuting or circuit attorney, state assistant prosecuting or circuit attorney, juvenile court commissioner, state probation or parole officer, [or] referee, or law enforcement officer.
- 3. A judicial officer's family for purposes of this section shall be:
- 17 (1) Such officer's spouse; or

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

18 (2) Such officer or such officer's spouse's ancestor or descendant by blood or adoption;

19 or

20 (3) Such officer's stepchild, while the marriage creating that relationship exists.

4. The offense of tampering with a judicial officer is a class D felony.
