AN ACT

To repeal section 542.525, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to landowner rights.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 542.525, RSMo, is repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as sections 252.047 and 542.525, to read as follows:

- 252.047. 1. The commission shall not require any resident or nonresident 2 landowner, as such terms are defined by rules promulgated by the commission, to 3 register the landowner's property before receiving any landowner hunting permit or to 4 possess any hunting permit to take wildlife on the landowner's property. Any existing 5 or future requirement for a landowner to register the landowner's property to receive any landowner hunting permit is hereby void.
- 2. The commission shall issue any landowner hunting permit requested by any resident or nonresident landowner who owns at least five acres of real property and 9 requests such landowner hunting permit.
- 10 3. (1) As used in this subsection, the term "immediate family member of the 11 landowner" means a landowner's spouse, child, stepchild, sibling, stepsibling, parent, stepparent, grandparent, grandchild, and any person in an adoptive relationship with 12 the landowner. 13
- 14 (2) A landowner who qualifies for any landowner hunting permit under this section may request any hunting permit authorizing the taking of wildlife on the landowner's property for a specified two-day period on behalf of one nonresident 16 17 immediate family member of the landowner. No more than one request shall be made in 18 a calendar year under this subsection.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

19 (3) The commission shall issue such hunting permit upon request. Such permit 20 shall be provided free of charge.

542.525. No employee of a state agency or a political subdivision of the state shall place any surveillance camera or game camera on private property without first obtaining consent from the landowner or the landowner's designee[;] or a search warrant as required by and under Article I, Section 15 of the Constitution of Missouri or the Fourth and Fourteenth Amendments of the Constitution of the United States[; or permission from the highest ranking law enforcement chief or officer of the agency or political subdivision, provided that permission of the highest ranking law enforcement chief or officer of the agency or political subdivision is valid only when the camera is facing a location that is open to public access or use and the camera is located within one hundred feet of the intended surveillance location].

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
