AN ACT

To amend chapter 191, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the prostate cancer pilot program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 191, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 191.951, to read as follows:

- 191.951. 1. As used in this section, the following terms mean:
- (1) "Department", the department of health and senior services;
- 3 (2) "Economically challenged men", men who have a gross income up to one 4 hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level;

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(3) "Program", the prostate cancer pilot program established in this section;

(4) "Rural area", a rural area which is in:

7 (a) Any county of the third classification without a township form of government 8 and with more than eighteen thousand but fewer than twenty thousand inhabitants and 9 with a city of the third classification with more than six thousand but fewer than seven 10 thousand inhabitants as the county seat;

11 (b) Any county of the third classification without a township form of government 12 and with more than eighteen thousand but fewer than twenty thousand inhabitants and 13 with a city of the fourth classification with more than three thousand but fewer than three 14 thousand seven hundred inhabitants as the county seat; or

15 (c) Any county of the third classification with a township form of government and 16 with more than thirty-one thousand but fewer than thirty-five thousand inhabitants;

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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17 (5) "Uninsured men", men for whom services provided by the program are not 18 covered by private insurance, MO HealthNet, or Medicare;

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(6) "Urban area", an urban area that is located in a city not within a county.

20 2. Subject to securing a cooperative agreement with a nonprofit entity for funding 21 of the program, there is hereby established within the department of health and senior 22 services two "Prostate Cancer Pilot Programs" to fund prostate cancer screening and 23 treatment services and to provide education to men residing in this state. One prostate 24 cancer pilot program shall be located in an urban area and one prostate cancer pilot 25 program shall be located in a rural area. The department may directly contract with the 26 Missouri Foundation for Health, or a successor entity, in the delivery of the pilot program. 27 For purposes of this section, the contracting process of the department with these entities 28 need not be governed by the provisions of chapter 34.

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3. The program shall be open to:

30 (1) Uninsured men or economically challenged men who are at least fifty years of 31 age; and

(2) On the advice of a physician or at the request of the individual, uninsured men
 or economically challenged men who are at least thirty-five years of age but less than fifty
 years of age and who are at high risk for prostate cancer.

35 **4.** The program shall provide:

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(1) Prostate cancer screening;

37 (2) Referral services, including services necessary for diagnosis;

38 (3) Treatment services for individuals who are diagnosed with prostate cancer after
 39 being screened; and

40 (4) Outreach and education activities to ensure awareness and utilization of 41 program services by uninsured men and economically challenged men.

42 5. Upon appropriation, the department shall distribute grants to administer the 43 program to:

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(1) Local health departments; and

45 (2) Federally qualified health centers.

46 6. Three years from the date on which the grants are first administered under this
47 section, the department shall report to the governor and general assembly:

48 (1) The number of individuals screened and treated under the program, including
 49 racial and ethnic data on the individuals who are screened and treated; and

50 (2) To the extent possible, any cost savings achieved by the program as a result of 51 early detection of prostate cancer.

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52 The department shall promulgate rules to establish guidelines regarding 7. 53 eligibility for the program and to implement the provisions of this section. Any rule or 54 portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the 55 authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This 56 57 section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested with the general 58 assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove 59 and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking 60 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2020, shall be invalid and 61 void.

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8. Under section 23.253 of the Missouri sunset act:

(1) The provisions of the new program authorized under this section shall
 automatically sunset six years after August 28, 2020, unless reauthorized by an act of the
 general assembly;

66 (2) If such program is reauthorized, the program authorized under this section 67 shall automatically sunset six years after the effective date of the reauthorization of this 68 section; and

(3) This section shall terminate on September first of the calendar year immediately
 following the calendar year in which the program authorized under this section is sunset.
