## AN ACT

To repeal section 302.188, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to veteran designations on driver's licenses.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 302.188, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 302.188, to read as follows:

302.188. 1. A person may apply to the department of revenue to obtain a veteran2 designation on a driver's license or identification card issued under this chapter by providing:

3 (1) A United States Department of Defense discharge document, otherwise known as a
4 DD Form 214, that shows a discharge status of "honorable" or "general under honorable
5 conditions" that establishes the person's service in the Armed Forces of the United States; or

6 (2) A United States Uniformed Services Identification Card, otherwise known as a DD
7 Form 2, that includes a discharge status of "retired" or "reserve retired" establishing the person's
8 service in the Armed Forces of the United States; or

(3) A United States Department of Veterans Affairs photo identification card; or

10 (4) A discharge document WD AGO 53, WD AGO 55, WD AGO 53-55, NAVPERS

11 553, NAVMC 78 PD, NAVCG 553, or DD 215 form that shows a discharge status of12 "honorable" or "general under honorable conditions"; and

(5) Payment of the fee for the driver's license or identification card authorized under thischapter.

15 2. If the person is seeking a duplicate driver's license with the veteran designation and 16 his or her driver's license has not expired, the fee shall be as provided under section 302.185.

The department of revenue may determine the appropriate placement of the veteran
 designation on the driver's licenses and identification cards authorized under this section and may
 promulgate the necessary rules for administration of this section. Beginning January 1, 2021,
 the veteran designation shall appear on the front of the driver's licenses and identification
 cards authorized under this section.
 4. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created

under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and
is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and if applicable, section 536.028. This section
and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly

26 pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule

27 are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule

28 proposed or adopted after August 28, 2012, shall be invalid and void.
