# **HOUSE BILL NO. 2166**

### 101ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY

#### INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE PORTER.

## AN ACT

To amend chapter 192, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to certification of radiologic imaging and radiation therapy personnel.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 192, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 192.3070, to read as follows:

192.3070. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:

- 2 (1) "Certified registered nurse anesthetist", the same meaning given to the term in section 335.016;
  - (2) "Department", the department of health and senior services;
- (3) "Ionizing radiation", radiation that may consist of alpha particles, beta particles, gamma rays, x-rays, neutrons, high-speed electrons, high-speed protons, or other particles capable of producing ions. The term "ionizing radiation" shall not 8 include nonionizing radiation, such as radiofrequency or microwaves, visible infrared or ultraviolet light, or ultrasound;
- (4) "Licensed practitioner", a person licensed to practice medicine, chiropractic 11 medicine, podiatry, or dentistry in this state with education and specialist training in the medical or dental use of radiation who is deemed competent to independently perform or supervise radiologic imaging or radiation therapy procedures by his or her respective state licensure board;
- 15 (5) "Limited x-ray machine operator", a person who is certified to perform only 16 x-ray or bone densitometry procedures not involving the administration or utilization of

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17 contrast media on selected specific parts of the human anatomy under the supervision of 18 a licensed practitioner;

- (6) "Nuclear medicine technologist", a person who is certified to perform a 20 variety of nuclear medicine and molecular imaging procedures using sealed and unsealed radiation sources, ionizing radiation, adjunctive medicine and pharmaceuticals associated with nuclear medicine procedures, and therapeutic procedures using sealed and unsealed radioactive sources;
  - "Radiation therapist", a person who is certified to administer ionizing radiation to humans for therapeutic purposes;
  - (8) "Radiographer", a person who is certified to perform a comprehensive set of diagnostic radiographic procedures using external ionizing radiation to produce radiographic, fluoroscopic, or digital images.
  - 2. Except as provided in subsection 9 of this section, no person shall provide the services of a radiographer, nuclear medicine technologist, radiation therapist, or limited x-ray machine operator unless such person is certified by the department.
  - 3. No person shall hold himself or herself out as a radiographer, nuclear medicine technologist, radiation therapist, or limited x-ray machine operator unless such person is certified by the department.
  - Any person seeking certification under this section shall complete an application form approved by the department and pay the required fee set by the department by rule.
  - 5. A person is eligible to be certified as a radiographer by the department if the person is currently certified as a radiographer by the American Registry of Radiologic **Technologists.**
  - 6. A person is eligible to be certified as a radiation therapist by the department if the person is currently certified as a radiation therapist by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists.
- 7. A person is eligible to be certified as a nuclear medicine technologist by the department if the person is currently certified as a nuclear medicine technologist by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists or the Nuclear Medicine Technology 47 Certification Board.
- 48 8. A person is eligible to be certified as a limited x-ray machine operator by the 49 department if the person:
- 50 (1) Is currently certified by the American Society of Podiatric Medical Assistants 51 or the International Society for Clinical Densitometry; or
- 52 (2) Has successfully passed an examination for limited x-ray machine operators 53 approved by the department.

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54 9. A person who has been providing services of a limited x-ray machine operator 55 but who does not meet the requirements described in subsection 8 of this section may 56 continue to practice as a limited x-ray machine operator, provided that such person:

- (1) Registers with the department before January 1, 2023;
- 58 (2) Does not change the scope of his or her current practice or current place of 59 employment; and
- 60 (3) Meets the requirements of subsection 8 of this section and the rules adopted by the department and obtains a certification from the department before October 1, 61 62 2025.
  - A radiographer, nuclear medicine technologist, radiation therapist, or limited x-ray machine operator shall practice in accordance with nationally recognized practice standards and scopes of practice for medical imaging personnel and under the supervision of a licensed practitioner.
  - 11. The provisions of this section shall not apply to, and shall not prohibit or restrict, the provision or performance of any service, treatment, care, or supervisory function provided by:
  - (1) A certified registered nurse anesthetist who is practicing within his or her scope of practice as recognized by the state board of nursing;
  - (2) A physician or surgeon licensed under chapter 334 who is practicing within his or her scope of practice;
  - (3) A dentist licensed under chapter 332 who is practicing within his or her scope of practice;
- 76 (4) A chiropractic physician licensed under chapter 331 who is practicing within 77 his or her scope of practice;
  - (5) A podiatrist licensed under chapter 330 who is practicing within his or her scope of practice; or
  - (6) A student enrolled in and attending a school or college of medicine, chiropractic, podiatry, radiologic imaging, or radiation therapy who performs radiologic imaging or radiation therapy services on humans while under the supervision of a licensed practitioner or a person certified under this section.
- 12. The department shall promulgate rules on the certification requirements under this section and any other rules necessary for the implementation of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested 90 with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date,

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- 91 or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant
- 92 of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2022, shall

93 be invalid and void.

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
