AN ACT

To repeal section 304.154, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to towing companies, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 304.154, RSMo, is repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as sections 304.153 and 304.154, to read as follows:

304.153. 1. As used in this section, the following terms shall mean:

- 2 (1) "Law enforcement officer", any public servant, other than a patrol officer, who
 3 is defined as a law enforcement officer under section 556.061;
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(2) "Patrol officer", a Missouri state highway patrol officer;

5 (3) "Tow list", a list of approved towing companies compiled, maintained, and 6 utilized by the Missouri state highway patrol or its designee;

7 (4) "Tow management company", any sole proprietorship, partnership,
8 corporation, fiduciary, association, or other business entity that manages towing logistics
9 for government agencies;

10 (5) "Tow truck", a rollback or car carrier, wrecker, or tow truck as defined under
 11 section 301.010;

(6) "Towing", moving or removing, or the preparation therefor, of a vehicle by
another vehicle for which a service charge is made, either directly or indirectly, including
any dues or other charges of clubs or associations which provide towing services;

(7) "Towing company", any person, partnership, corporation, fiduciary,
 association, or other entity that operates a wrecker or towing service as defined under
 section 301.010.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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In authorizing a towing company to perform services, any patrol officer within
 the officer's jurisdiction may utilize the services of a tow management company or tow list.

3. A patrol officer shall not use a towing company located outside of Missouri
 under this section except under the following circumstances:

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(1) A state or federal emergency has been declared; or

23 (2) The driver or owner of the vehicle requests a specific out-of-state towing24 company.

4. Any towing company or tow truck arriving at the scene of an accident that has not been called by a patrol officer, a law enforcement officer, or the driver or owner of the vehicle or his or her authorized agent shall be prohibited from towing the vehicle from the scene of the accident, unless the towing company or tow truck operator is rendering emergency aid in the interest of public safety, or is operating during a declared state of emergency under section 44.100.

5. A tow truck operator that stops and tows a vehicle from the scene of an accident in violation of subsection 4 of this section shall be guilty of a class D misdemeanor upon conviction or pleading guilty for the first violation, and such tow truck shall be subject to impounding. The penalty for a second violation shall be a class A misdemeanor, and the penalty for any third or subsequent violation shall be a class D felony. A violation of this section shall not preclude the tow truck operator from being charged with tampering under chapter 569.

38 6. The provisions of this section shall also apply to motor vehicles towed under
 39 section 304.155 or 304.157.

304.154. 1. [Beginning January 1, 2005,] A towing company operating a tow truck 2 pursuant to the authority granted in section **304.153**, 304.155, or 304.157 shall:

3 (1) Have and occupy a verifiable business address and display such address in a
4 location visible from the street or road;

5 (2) Have a fenced, secure, and lighted storage lot or an enclosed, secure building for the 6 storage of motor vehicles with a total area for storing vehicles either inside or outside of at 7 least two thousand square feet and fencing a minimum of seven feet high;

8 (3) Be open for a minimum of eight hours per day between the hours of 7:00 a.m. 9 and 7:00 p.m. Monday through Friday for a customer or his or her authorized agent to 10 view or retrieve a vehicle with no additional fees charged to view or retrieve a vehicle 11 during these regular business hours;

[(3)] (4) Be available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Availability shall
mean that an employee of the towing company or an answering service answered by a person is
able to respond to a tow request;

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- [(4)] (5) Have and maintain an operational telephone with the telephone number
 published or available through directory assistance;
- (6) Maintain a valid insurance policy issued by an insurer authorized to do business in
 this state, or a bond or other acceptable surety providing coverage for the death of, or injury to,
 persons and damage to property for each accident or occurrence in the amount of at least five
 hundred thousand dollars per incident;
- 21 [(5)] (7) Provide workers' compensation insurance for all employees of the towing 22 company if required by chapter 287; [and]
- [(6)] (8) Maintain current motor vehicle registrations on all tow trucks currently operated
 within the towing company fleet; and
- (9) Post at its place of business and make available upon request to consumers a
 rate sheet listing all current rates applicable to towing services provided under this
 chapter.
- 28 2. The initial tow performed under section 304.153, 304.155, or 304.157 shall 29 remain in the state of Missouri unless authorized by the vehicle owner or his or her agent.
- 30 **3.** Counties may adopt ordinances with respect to towing company standards in addition
- 31 to the minimum standards contained in this section. A towing company located in a county of
- 32 the second, third, [and] or fourth classification is exempt from the provisions of this section.

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
