AN ACT

To amend chapter 589, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the establishment of the Community Crime Reduction Grant Program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 589, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 589.805, to read as follows:

589.805. 1. The department of public safety shall establish a pilot program to be
known as the "Community Crime Reduction Grant Program" to provide moneys to
qualifying municipal police departments, as provided under subsection 2 of this section.
Grants provided under this section shall be subject to appropriation by the general
assembly and shall be equally dispersed amongst qualifying municipal police departments.
2. To be eligible for a grant under the program, the municipal police department
shall:

8 (1) Employ less than two officers per one thousand people, as measured by the 9 Bureau of Justice Statistics, Office of Justice Programs, within the U.S. Department of 10 Justice; and

11 (2) Serve a city with a population of seventy-five thousand inhabitants to one 12 hundred twenty-five thousand inhabitants that is located in a first class county with a 13 noncharter form of government.

3. Grants received by a municipal police department under this program shall be
 used as payment for the following:

16 (1) Up to fifty percent of the cost of employing new law enforcement officers needed 17 to raise the department's officer to population ratio to two officers per one thousand people

20 (2) Up to one hundred percent of the cost for law enforcement officers hired with 21 grant moneys by the municipal police department to attend not less than one seminar 22 relating to fair and impartial policing and one seminar relating to racial sensitivity at the 23 University of Missouri Law Enforcement Training Institute.

4. Municipal police departments receiving grants under the pilot program shall submit an annual report to the department of public safety on or before December thirtyfirst of each year in which the department received a grant, including the following information:

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(1) An itemized list of how the moneys were used;

(2) The number of law enforcement officers hired;

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30 (3) The number of hours of advanced training obtained by law enforcement 31 officers:

32 (4) The municipal police department's plans to retain officers hired with grant 33 moneys once such moneys expire; and

34 (5) The most recent crime statistics within the municipality compared to the crime 35 statistics when the municipal police department initiated participation in the pilot 36 program.

37 5. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Community Crime Reduction 38 Program Fund", which shall consist of all gifts, bequests, transfers, and moneys 39 appropriated by the general assembly under this section. The state treasurer shall be 40 custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state treasurer 41 may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon appropriation, 42 moneys in the fund shall be used solely by the department of public safety to issue grants 43 to qualifying municipal police departments through the pilot program established under 44 this section. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080, to the contrary, any moneys 45 remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the 46 general revenue fund; however, if at the end of fiscal year 2021 the fund remains 47 unutilized, any moneys remaining in the fund shall revert to the credit of the general 48 revenue fund in fiscal year 2022. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such 49 50 investments shall be credited to the fund.

51 6. The department of public safety shall administer the grants issued under the 52 pilot program and promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration 53 of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that HB 2466

54 is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it 55 complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, 56 section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers 57 vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective 58 date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the 59 grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2016, 60 shall be invalid and void.

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7. Pursuant to section 23.253 of the Missouri sunset act:

(1) The provisions of the new program authorized under this section shall
automatically sunset four years after the effective date of this section unless reauthorized
by an act of the general assembly;

65 (2) If such program is reauthorized, the program authorized under this section 66 shall automatically sunset ten years after the effective date of the reauthorization of this 67 section; and

(3) This section shall terminate on September first of the calendar year immediately
 following the calendar year in which the program authorized under this section is sunset.

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
