## **AN ACT**

To repeal section 9.015, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to federal holidays, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 9.015, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 9.015, to read as follows:

- 9.015. 1. No state or local governmental entity, public building, public park, public school, or public setting or place shall ban or otherwise restrict the practice, mention, celebration, or discussion of any federal holiday.
- 2. The following persons may bring an action in a court of competent jurisdiction to enjoin any violation of this section or to recover compensatory damages, reasonable court costs, and attorney's fees:
  - (1) The attorney general; and
- (2) Persons whose expressive rights were violated through the violation of this section.
- 3. In an action brought under subsection 2 of this section, if the court finds a violation, the court shall award the aggrieved persons no less than five hundred dollars for the initial violation, plus fifty dollars for each day the violation remains ongoing.
- 4. A person shall be required to bring suit for violation of this section not later than one year after the day the cause of action accrues. For purposes of calculating the one-year 14 15 limitation period, each day that the violation persists, and each day that a policy in violation of this section remains in effect, shall constitute a new violation of this section 16 and, therefore, a new day that the cause of action has accrued.
