## **AN ACT**

To amend chapter 590, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the establishment of a task force on civilian review boards.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 590, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 590.657, to read as follows:

590.657. 1. There is hereby established in the department of public safety a "Task Force on Civilian Review Boards".

- 2. The task force shall have a membership of nine persons appointed by the governor. Membership may include, but not be limited to, representatives of the following groups:
- 6 (1) Civic organizations;
- 7 (2) Community-based organizations;
- 8 (3) Local government;
- 9 (4) Local police organizations;
- 10 (5) Licensed attorneys with experience in criminal defense who are in no way 11 involved in prosecuting crimes; and
- 12 (6) The National Association for Civilian Oversight of Law Enforcement 13 (NACOLE).
- 3. The director of the department of public safety or the director's designee shall convene the first meeting of the task force for the purpose of establishing bylaws and electing officers to include a chairperson, vice chairperson, and secretary. The task force

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shall not meet more than four times annually. Members may be reimbursed for expenses
but shall not receive a per diem allowance.

4. The task force shall:

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- (1) Clarify the civilian review board's power to receive, investigate, make findings, and recommend disciplinary action upon complaints by members of the public against members of the police department that allege misconduct involving excessive use of force, abuse of authority, discourtesy, or use of offensive language including, but not limited to, slurs relating to race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, and disability; and
- (2) Make recommendations to law enforcement agencies and communities that may help the civilian review board perform its duties.

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
