AN ACT

To repeal sections 407.924, 407.925, 407.926, 407.927, 407.928, 407.929, 407.931, 407.933, and 407.934, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof ten new sections relating to tobacco products, with penalty provisions and a delayed effective date.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 407.924, 407.925, 407.926, 407.927, 407.928, 407.929, 407.931, 407.933, and 407.934, RSMo, are repealed and ten new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 407.924, 407.925, 407.926, 407.927, 407.928, 407.929, 407.930, 407.931, 407.933, and 407.934, to read as follows:

407.924. 1. The division of [liquor] alcohol and tobacco control within the 2 department of public safety shall implement and enforce the provisions of sections [407.925] 3 407.924 to 407.934.

2. Beginning January 1, 2003, the division [of liquor control] shall submit an annual report to the general assembly on the effectiveness of sections [407.925] 407.924 to 407.934 in reducing tobacco [possession] use by [minors] persons under twenty-one years of age and the enforcement activities by the division for violations of sections [407.925] 407.924 to 407.934.

407.925. As used in sections [407.925] 407.924 to 407.934, the following terms 2 mean:

3 (1) "Alternative nicotine product", any noncombustible product containing nicotine 4 that is intended for human consumption, whether chewed, absorbed, dissolved, or ingested by 5 any other means. Alternative nicotine product does not include any vapor product, tobacco

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6 product or any product regulated as a drug or device by the [United States] U.S. Food and

7 Drug Administration under Chapter V of the Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act;

8 (2) ["Center of youth activities", any playground, school or other facility, when such 9 facility is being used primarily by persons under the age of eighteen for recreational, 10 educational or other purposes;

11 12 (3)] "Distribute", a conveyance to the public by sale, barter, gift or sample;

[(4) "Minor", a person under the age of eighteen;

13 (5)] (3) "Division", the division of alcohol and tobacco control within the 14 department of public safety;

15 (4) "Municipality", the city, village or town within which tobacco products, 16 alternative nicotine products or vapor products are sold or distributed or, in the case of 17 tobacco products, alternative nicotine products or vapor products that are not sold or 18 distributed within a city, village or town, the county in which they are sold or distributed;

19 [(6)] (5) "Nicotine liquid container", a bottle or other container of liquid or other 20 substance containing varying amounts of nicotine, flavorings, or other chemicals that is 21 sold, marketed, or intended for use in a vapor product but does not include a liquid or 22 other substance containing nicotine in a cartridge that is sold, marketed, or intended for 23 use in a vapor product if such cartridge is prefilled and sealed by the manufacturer and 24 not intended to be opened by the consumer;

(6) "Person", an individual, partnership, copartnership, firm, company, public or private corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate, political subdivision or any agency, board, department or bureau of the state or federal government, or any other legal entity which is recognized by law as the subject of rights and duties;

(7) "Proof of age", a driver's license or other [generally accepted means of]
government-issued identification that contains a person's date of birth and [a] picture [of
the individual] and appears on its face to be valid;

(8) "Rolling papers", paper designed, manufactured, marketed, or sold for use
primarily as a wrapping or enclosure for tobacco, which enables a person to roll loose tobacco
into a smokable cigarette;

(9) "Sample", a tobacco product, alternative nicotine product, or vapor product
 distributed to members of the general public at no cost or at nominal cost for product
 promotional purposes;

(10) "Sampling", the distribution to members of the general public of tobaccoproduct, alternative nicotine product or vapor product samples;

40 (11) "Tobacco products", any substance [containing tobacco leaf,] made or derived
41 from tobacco or nicotine that is intended for human consumption including, but not
42 limited to, cigarettes, cigars, pipe tobacco, snuff, chewing tobacco, or [dipping tobacco but

does not include alternative nicotine products, or] vapor products. "Tobacco products" also
means any component or accessory used in the consumption of tobacco products,
regardless of whether the component or accessory contains nicotine including, but not
limited to, filters, cartridges, pods, pens, rolling papers, and pipes;

47 (12) "Vapor product", any noncombustible product containing nicotine, whether 48 natural or synthetic, that employs a heating element, power source, electronic circuit, or 49 other electronic, chemical or mechanical means, regardless of shape or size, that can be used 50 to produce vapor from nicotine in a solution or other form. [Vapor product] "Vapor product" includes any electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic 51 pipe, or similar product or device and any vapor cartridge or other container of nicotine in a 52 solution or other form that is intended to be used with or in an electronic cigarette, electronic 53 54 cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, or similar product or device. "Vapor product" 55 also includes any device classified by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration as an electronic nicotine delivery system. [Vapor product] "Vapor product" does not include 56 57 any alternative nicotine product [or tobacco product];

58 (13) "Vending machine", any mechanical electric or electronic, self-service device 59 which, upon insertion of money, tokens or any other form of payment, dispenses tobacco 60 products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products.

407.926. 1. Any person or entity who sells tobacco products, alternative nicotine 2 products, or vapor products shall deny the sale of such tobacco products to any person who is 3 less than [eighteen] twenty-one years of age.

4 2. [Any person] The owner of the establishment or entity [who] that sells or distributes tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products by mail or 5 through the internet in this state in violation of subsection 1 of this section shall be assessed a 6 7 fine of [two] five hundred [fifty] dollars for the first violation and [five hundred dollars] shall 8 be prohibited from selling or distributing tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products for a period of one month for each subsequent violation, with 9 10 a fine of five hundred dollars per day for any violation of such sales or distribution 11 prohibition.

Alternative nicotine products and vapor products shall only be sold to persons
 [eighteen] twenty-one years of age or older[-] and shall be subject to local and state sales tax
 [, but shall not be otherwise taxed or]. Alternative nicotine and vapor products shall be
 regulated as tobacco products.

4. (1) Any nicotine liquid container that is sold at retail in this state shall satisfy the child-resistant effectiveness standards set forth in 16 CFR 1700.15(b) as in effect on August 28, 2015, when tested in accordance with the method described in 16 CFR 1700.20 as in effect on August 28, 2015.

20 (2) [For the purposes of this subsection, "nicotine liquid container" shall mean a 21 bottle or other container of liquid or other substance containing nicotine if the liquid or 22 substance is sold, marketed, or intended for use in a vapor product. A "nicotine liquid 23 container" shall not include a liquid or other substance containing nicotine in a cartridge that 24 is sold, marketed, or intended for use in a vapor product, provided that such cartridge is 25 prefilled and sealed by the manufacturer and not intended to be opened by the consumer.

Any person who engages in retail sales of liquid nicotine containers in this state in violation of this subsection shall be assessed a fine of two hundred fifty dollars for the first violation and five hundred dollars for each subsequent violation.

29 [(4)] (3) The department of health and senior services may adopt rules necessary to carry out the provisions of this subsection. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is 30 defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall 31 become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 32 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any 33 of the powers vested with the general assembly under chapter 536 to review, to delay the 34 35 effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2015, 36 37 shall be invalid and void.

38 [(5) The provisions of this subsection and any rules adopted hereunder shall be null, 39 void, and of no force and effect upon the effective date of the final regulations issued by the 40 federal Food and Drug Administration or from any other federal agency if such regulations 41 mandate child-resistant effectiveness standards for nicotine liquid containers.]

407.927. The owner of an establishment at which tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, vapor products, or rolling papers are [sold at retail or through vending machines] distributed shall cause to be prominently displayed in a conspicuous place at every display from which tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products are sold and on every vending machine where tobacco products are [purchased] distributed a sign that shall:

7 (1) Contain in red lettering at least one-half inch high on a white background the 8 following: "It is a violation of state law for cigarettes, other tobacco products, alternative 9 nicotine products, or vapor products to be sold or otherwise provided to any person under the 10 age of [eighteen or for such person to purchase, attempt to purchase or possess cigarettes, 11 other tobacco products, alternative nicotine products or vapor products] twenty-one."; and

12 (2) Include a depiction of a pack of cigarettes at least two inches high defaced by a 13 red diagonal diameter of a surrounding red circle, and the words "Under [18] 21".

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407.928. No person or entity shall sell individual packs of cigarettes, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, vapor products, or smokeless tobacco products 2 3 unless such packs satisfy one of the following conditions prior to the time of sale:

- 4 (1) It is sold through a vending machine located in an establishment not accessible 5 to persons under twenty-one years of age; or
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(2) It is displayed behind the check-out counter [or it is within the unobstructed line 7 of sight of the sales elerk or store attendant from the eheekout counter].

407.929. 1. A person or entity selling tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products or rolling papers or distributing tobacco product, alternative nicotine 2 product, or vapor product samples shall require proof of age from a prospective purchaser or 3 recipient if an ordinary person would conclude on the basis of appearance that such 4 5 prospective purchaser or recipient may be under the age of [eighteen] thirty.

6 2. The operator's or chauffeur's license issued pursuant to the provisions of section 302.177, or the operator's or chauffeur's license issued pursuant to the laws of any state or 7 possession of the United States to residents of those states or possessions, or an identification 8 9 card as provided for in section 302.181, or the identification card issued by any uniformed service of the United States, or a valid passport shall be presented by the holder thereof upon 10 11 request of any agent of the division [of liquor control] or any owner or employee of an establishment that sells tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products, 12 13 for the purpose of aiding the [registrant] owner, agent, or employee to determine whether or 14 not the person is at least [eighteen] twenty-one years of age when such person desires to 15 purchase [or possess] tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products [procured from a registrant]. Upon such presentation, the owner or employee of the 16 establishment shall compare the photograph and physical characteristics noted on the license, 17 identification card or passport with the physical characteristics of the person presenting the 18 license, identification card or passport. 19

20 3. Any person who shall, without authorization from the department of revenue, 21 reproduce, alter, modify or misrepresent any chauffeur's license, motor vehicle operator's 22 license or identification card shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction 23 shall be subject to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars, and confinement for not more 24 than one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

25 4. Reasonable reliance on proof of age [or on the appearance of the purchaser or recipient] shall be a defense to any action for a violation of subsections 1[-] and 2 [and 3] of 26 27 section 407.931. [No person shall be liable for more than one violation of subsections 2 and 3 28 of section 407.931 on any single day.]

407.930. 1. No person or entity shall sell cigarettes, tobacco products, alternative 2 nicotine products, or vapor products unless the person has a retail sales tax license.

2. In addition to the retail sales tax license required under subsection 1 of this section, any person or entity selling, providing, or distributing tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products, in any quantity, shall apply with the division of alcohol and tobacco control for a license under subsection 3 of this section prior to such sale, provision, or distribution through an application on the division's website.

9 3. All persons or entities selling, providing, or distributing tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products, in any quantity, on or before January 10 1, 2023, shall have forty-five days to apply with the division for a license to sell, provide, 11 or distribute tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products, during 12 which time such persons or entities may continue to sell, provide, or distribute such 13 14 products; provided that, such persons or entities shall be required to apply with the 15 division by the end of the forty-five-day period in order to continue to sell, provide, or 16 distribute such products. All other persons or entities selling, providing, or distributing 17 such products after January 1, 2023, shall be required to apply with the division and be 18 approved prior to engaging in such sale, provision, or distribution in this state. For 19 every license for selling, providing, or distributing tobacco products, alternative nicotine 20 products, or vapor products, the licensee shall pay to the director of revenue the sum of 21 one hundred dollars.

4. (1) On approval of the application and payment of the license fee provided in this section, the division of alcohol and tobacco control shall grant the applicant a license to sell, provide, or distribute tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products for a term to expire on the thirtieth day of June next succeeding the date of such license. A separate license shall be required for each place of business. Of the fee to be paid for any such license, the fee shall be prorated on a monthly basis for the months remaining from the date of the license to the next succeeding July first.

(2) The division shall provide the applicant a notice of license that the applicant
shall prominently display at the location address for which the applicant received such
notice. The notice shall clearly state the licensed location address and the valid license
time period on the face of the notice.

5. (1) All persons or entities shall apply for renewal of their license annually for each location at which tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products shall be sold, provided, or distributed. Each location licensed shall be accompanied by a license renewal fee of one hundred dollars payable to the director of revenue.

(2) Applications for renewal of licenses shall be filed on or before the first day of
 May of each calendar year.

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40 (3) In case of failure to submit the completed renewal application required under 41 this subsection on or before the first day of May, there shall be added to the amount of 42 the renewal fee a late charge of fifty dollars from the second day of May to the last day 43 of May; a late charge of one hundred dollars if the renewal application is submitted on 44 the first day of June to the last day of June; or a late charge of one hundred fifty dollars 45 if the renewal application is submitted after the last day of June.

46 (4) The license fee and associated late charges provided for under this subsection
47 shall be allocated as follows:

48 (a) One-half to the division, for the costs to administer and maintain the registry 49 and to enforce the provisions of sections 407.924 to 407.934; and

50 (b) One-half to the department of health and senior services for tobacco 51 prevention and cessation activities.

407.931. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to sell, provide or distribute
tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, rolling papers, or vapor products to persons
under [eighteen] twenty-one years of age, or sell individual cigarettes to any person in this
state.

5 2. All vending machines that dispense tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, 6 or vapor products shall be located within [the unobstructed line of sight and under the direct supervision of an adult responsible for preventing persons less than eighteen years of age 7 from purchasing any tobacco product, alternative nicotine product, or vapor product from 8 such machine or shall be equipped with a lock out device to prevent the machines from being 9 operated until the person responsible for monitoring sales from the machines disables the 10 lock. Such locking device shall be of a design that prevents it from being left in an unlocked 11 condition and which will allow only a single sale when activated. A locking device shall not 12 be required on machines that are located in areas where persons less than eighteen years of 13 age are not permitted or prohibited by law] establishments that persons under twenty-one 14 years of age are prohibited from accessing. An owner of an establishment whose vending 15 16 machine is not in compliance with the provisions of this subsection shall be subject to the penalties contained in subsection [5] 3 of this section. A determination of noncompliance 17 may be made by a local law enforcement agency or the division [of liquor control. Nothing in 18 this section shall apply to a vending machine if located in a factory, private club or other 19 location not generally accessible to the general public]. 20 21 3. [No person or entity shall sell, provide or distribute any tobacco product,

22 alternative nicotine product, or vapor product or rolling papers to any minor, or sell any 23 individual cigarettes to any person in this state. This subsection shall not apply to the 24 distribution by family members on property that is not open to the public.

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Any person including, but not limited to, a sales clerk, owner or operator who
 violates subsection 1, 2 or 3 of this section or section 407.927 shall be penalized as follows:

27 (1) For the first offense, twenty-five dollars;

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(2) For the second offense, one hundred dollars;

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(3) For a third and subsequent offense, two hundred fifty dollars.

30 5.] Any owner of the establishment where tobacco products, alternative nicotine 31 products, or vapor products are available for [sale who violates subsection 3 of this section, in 32 addition to the penalties established in subsection 4 of this section,] distribution and where 33 a violation of any provision of sections 407.927 to 407.929 or this section occurs shall be 34 penalized in the following manner:

35 (1) For the first [violation per location within two years, a reprimand shall be issued
36 by the division of liquor control] offense within thirty-six months, the division shall issue a
37 written warning describing the failure and how to address the failure within seven days;

38 (2) For the second [violation per location within two years, the division of liquor
39 control] offense within thirty-six months, the division shall issue a citation prohibiting the
40 [outlet] location from selling, providing, or distributing tobacco products, alternative
41 nicotine products, or vapor products for a [twenty-four-hour] ten-day period. Any person or
42 entity in violation of this citation shall be assessed a fine of five hundred dollars per day
43 such person or entity sells, provides, or distributes such products;

(3) For the third [violation per location within two years, the division of liquor control] offense within thirty-six months, the division shall issue a citation prohibiting the [outlet] location from selling, providing, or distributing tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products for a [forty-eight-hour] sixty-day period. Any person or entity in violation of this citation shall be assessed a fine of five hundred dollars per day such person or entity sells, provides, or distributes such products; and

50 (4) For the fourth [and any subsequent violations per location within two years, the 51 division of liquor control] offense within thirty-six months, the division shall issue a 52 citation prohibiting the [outlet] location from selling, providing, or distributing tobacco 53 products [for a five-day period] permanently. Any person or entity in violation of this 54 citation shall be assessed a fine of five hundred dollars per day such person or entity 55 sells, provides, or distributes such products.

4. In addition to any other penalty, any owner of the establishment where tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products are available for distribution and where a violation of sections 407.924 to 407.934, or any federal law relating to tobacco product, alternative nicotine product, or vapor product sales occurs shall be subject to penalties stated in this section, including fines, license suspension, and license revocation.

62 [6. Any owner of the establishment where tobacco products are available for sale who 63 violates subsection 3 of this section shall not be penalized pursuant to this section if such 64 person documents the following: 65 (1) An in-house or other tobacco compliance employee training program was in place to provide the employee with information on the state and federal regulations regarding sales 66 of tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products to minors. Such training 67 68 program must be attended by all employees who sell tobacco products, alternative nicotine 69 products, or vapor products to the general public; 70 (2) A signed statement by the employee stating that the employee has been trained and understands the state laws and federal regulations regarding the sale of tobacco products, 71 alternative nicotine products, or vapor products to minors; and 72 73 (3) Such in-house or other tobacco compliance training meets the minimum training eriteria, which shall not exceed a total of ninety minutes in length, established by the division 74 75 of liquor control. 76 7. The exemption in subsection 6 of this section shall not apply to any person who is 77 considered the general owner or operator of the outlet where tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products are available for sale if: 78 79 (1) Four or more violations per location of subsection 3 of this section occur within a 80 one-year period; or (2) Such person knowingly violates or knowingly allows his or her employees to 81 violate subsection 3 of this section. 82 8. If a sale is made by an employee of the owner of an establishment in violation of 83 sections 407.925 to 407.934, the employee shall be guilty of an offense established in 84 subsections 1, 2 and 3 of this section. If a vending machine is in violation of section 407.927, 85 the owner of the establishment shall be guilty of an offense established in subsections 3 and 4 86 87 of this section. If a sample is distributed by an employee of a company conducting the sampling, such employee shall be guilty of an offense established in subsections 3 and 4 of 88 89 this section. 90 9. A person cited for selling, providing or distributing any tobacco product, alternative nicotine product, or vapor product to any individual less than eighteen years of age 91 in violation of subsection 1, 2 or 3 of this section shall conclusively be presumed to have 92 reasonably relied on proof of age of the purchaser or recipient, and such person shall not be 93 94 found guilty of such violation if such person raises and proves as an affirmative defense that 95 such individual presented a driver's license or other government-issued photo identification

96 purporting to establish that such individual was eighteen years of age or older.

97 10.] 5. Any person adversely affected by this section may file an appeal with the 98 administrative hearing commission which shall be adjudicated pursuant to the procedures 99 established in chapter 621.

407.933. 1. No person less than [eighteen] twenty-one years of age shall purchase, 2 attempt to purchase or possess cigarettes, other tobacco products, alternative nicotine 3 products, or vapor products unless such person is an employee of a seller of cigarettes, 4 tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products and is in such possession to 5 effect a sale in the course of employment, or an employee of the division [of liquor control] 6 for enforcement purposes pursuant to [subsection 5 of] section 407.934.

2. Any person less than [eighteen] twenty-one years of age shall not misrepresent his
or her age to purchase cigarettes, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor
products.

10 3. Any person who violates the provisions of this section shall be penalized as 11 follows:

(1) For the first violation, the person is guilty of an infraction and shall have any
cigarettes, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products confiscated; and
(2) For a second violation and any subsequent violations, the person is guilty of an

infraction, shall have any cigarettes, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor
products confiscated and shall complete a tobacco education or smoking cessation program, if
available.

407.934. 1. [No person shall sell cigarettes, tobacco products, alternative nicotine
2 products, or vapor products unless the person has a retail sales tax license.

2. The department of revenue shall permit persons to designate through the internet or
by including a place on all sales tax license applications for the applicant to designate himself
or herself as a seller of tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products and
to provide a list of all locations where the applicant sells such products.

3. On or before July first of each year, the department of revenue shall make available
to the division of liquor control and the department of mental health a complete list of every
establishment which sells cigarettes, other tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or
vapor products in this state.

4.] The division [of liquor control] shall have the authority to inspect stores [and], tobacco outlets, and any registered entity under section 407.930 for compliance with all laws related to access of tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products to [minors] persons under twenty-one years of age and the provisions of sections 407.924 to 407.934. The division may employ a person [seventeen] between sixteen and twenty years of age, with parental consent for a person under eighteen years of age, to attempt to purchase tobacco products or alternative nicotine products for the purpose of inspection or 18 enforcement of tobacco laws. The division shall conduct inspections of retailers to ensure
 19 compliance with sections 407.924 to 407.934.

20 2. A compliance check by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration program that 21 is contracted through the division shall satisfy the required compliance check of the 22 state.

[5.] 3. The [supervisor of] the division [of liquor control] shall not use [minors] persons under twenty-one years of age to enforce the provisions of this chapter unless the [supervisor] division promulgates rules that establish standards for the use of [minors] persons under twenty-one years of age. The [supervisor] division shall establish mandatory guidelines for the use of [minors] persons under twenty-one years of age in investigations by a state, county, municipal or other local law enforcement authority which shall be followed by such authority and which shall, at a minimum, provide for the following:

30 (1) The [minor] person shall be [seventeen] between sixteen and twenty years of
 31 age;

32 (2) The [minor] person shall have a youthful appearance, and [the minor], if a male,
33 shall not have facial hair or a receding hairline and if a female, shall not wear excessive
34 makeup or excessive jewelry;

(3) The state, county, municipal or other local law enforcement agency shall obtain
the consent of the [minor's] person's parent or legal guardian before the use of such [minor]
person, on a form approved by the [supervisor] division, if the person is under eighteen
years of age;

39 (4) The state, county, municipal or other local law enforcement agency shall make a
40 photocopy of the [minor's] person's valid identification showing the [minor's] person's
41 correct date of birth;

42 (5) Any attempt by such [minor] **person** to purchase tobacco products, alternative 43 nicotine products, or vapor products shall be videotaped or audiotaped with equipment 44 sufficient to record all statements made by the [minor] **person** and the seller of the tobacco 45 product, **alternative nicotine product**, **or vapor product**;

46 (6) The [minor] person shall carry his or her own identification showing [the minor's]
47 his or her correct date of birth and shall, upon request, produce such identification to the
48 seller of the tobacco product, alternative nicotine product, or vapor product;

49 (7) The [minor] person shall answer truthfully any questions about his or her age and 50 shall not remain silent when asked questions regarding his or her age;

51 (8) The [minor] person shall not lie to the seller of the tobacco product, alternative 52 nicotine product, or vapor product to induce a sale of tobacco products, alternative nicotine 53 products, or vapor products;

54 (9) The [minor] person shall not be employed by the state, county, municipal or other 55 local law enforcement agency on an incentive or quota basis;

56 (10) The state, county, municipal or other local law enforcement agency shall, within 57 forty-eight hours, contact or take all reasonable steps to contact the owner or manager of the 58 establishment if a violation occurs;

(11) The state, county, municipal or other local law enforcement agency shall maintain records of each visit to an establishment where a [minor] person under twenty-one years of age is used by the state, county, municipal or other local law enforcement agency for a period of at least one year following the incident, regardless of whether a violation occurs at each visit, and such records shall, at a minimum, include the following information:

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(b) A [Polaroid] photograph of the [minor] person;
