AN ACT

To repeal sections 332.011 and 332.311, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to dental hygienists.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 332.011 and 332.311, RSMo, are repealed and two new sections 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 332.011 and 332.311, to read as follows:

332.011. As used in this chapter, the following words and terms mean:

2 (1) "Accredited dental hygiene school", any program which teaches a course in dental 3 hygiene which is accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental 4 Association and which shall have a minimum of two academic years of curriculum provided in 5 a college or institution of higher education;

6 (2) "Accredited dental school", any college, university, school, or other institution which 7 teaches dentistry which has been certified by the American Dental Association;

- 8 (3) "Board", the Missouri dental board;
- 9 (4) "Certified dental assistant", a dental assistant who is currently certified by the Dental 10 Assisting National Board, Inc.;

(5) "Dental assistant", an employee of a duly registered and currently licensed dentist inMissouri, other than either a dental hygienist or a certified dental assistant;

13 (6) "Expanded-functions dental assistant", any dental assistant who has passed a basic 14 dental assisting skills mastery examination or a certified dental assistant, either of whom has 15 successfully completed a board-approved expanded-functions course, passed a competency 16 examination, and has obtained a permit authorizing them to perform expanded-functions duties 17 from the Missouri dental board:

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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18 (7) "Expanded-functions duties", reversible acts that would be considered the practice 19 of dentistry as defined in section 332.071 that the board specifies by rule may be delegated to a 20 dental assistant or dental hygienist who possesses an expanded-functions permit;

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(8) "Extended access", a written agreement that authorizes a dental hygienist who 22 is duly registered and currently licensed in Missouri to provide dental hygiene services 23 outlined in subdivision (4) of subsection 3 of section 332.311 through a partnering 24 arrangement with a dentist who is duly registered and currently licensed in Missouri.

332.311. 1. Except as provided in [subsection] subsections 2 and 3 of this section, a duly registered and currently licensed dental hygienist may only practice as a dental hygienist so 2 3 long as the dental hygienist is employed by a dentist who is duly registered and currently licensed 4 in Missouri, or as an employee of such other person or entity approved by the board in accordance with rules promulgated by the board. In accordance with this chapter and the rules 5 promulgated by the board pursuant thereto, a dental hygienist shall only practice under the 6 7 supervision of a dentist who is duly registered and currently licensed in Missouri, except as 8 provided in [subsection] subsections 2 and 3 of this section.

9 2. A duly registered and currently licensed dental hygienist who has been in practice at 10 least three years and who is practicing in a public health setting may provide fluoride treatments, 11 teeth cleaning and sealants, if appropriate, to children who are eligible for medical assistance, 12 pursuant to chapter 208, without the supervision of a dentist. Medicaid shall reimburse any 13 eligible provider who provides fluoride treatments, teeth cleaning, and sealants to eligible 14 children. Those public health settings in which a dental hygienist may practice without the 15 supervision of a dentist shall be established jointly by the department of health and senior 16 services and by the Missouri dental board by rule.

17 3. (1) A registered and currently licensed dental hygienist in Missouri may work 18 in an extended access agreement with a dentist who is duly registered and currently 19 licensed in Missouri.

20 (2) The extended access agreement shall outline the protocols for practice, 21 description of services allowed, populations to be served, the responsibilities of the 22 partnering dentist and hygienist regarding a dental exam by a dentist, consultation, record 23 maintenance, emergency management plan, and referral procedures.

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(3) To work under an extended access agreement, the hygienist shall:

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(a) Have practiced two thousand hours within the last five years;

26 (b) Obtain a permit for extended access from the Missouri dental board with the 27 names of the partnering dentists;

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(c) Perform a dental hygiene-focused assessment at each visit;

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(d) Have the patient examined by the partnering dentist within one year of the
 initial visit to the dental hygienist for the determination of additional dental treatment;

(e) Be covered by his or her own professional liability insurance; and

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(f) Notify the Missouri dental board of any changes in extended access partners.

(4) Clinical services allowed include scaling and polishing, dental sealants, fluoride treatments, periodontal root planing, debridement, curettage, radiographs, nonsurgical periodontal procedures, all services delegable to a dental assistant except for the expanded functions that require a permit, and other procedures set by and in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by the board based on the extended access agreement.

(5) All populations outlined in the extended access agreement can receive dental
 hygiene services within or outside the usual location of the partnering dentist within a
 sixty-mile radius.

41 (6) No dentist may partner with more than three dental hygienists utilizing 42 extended access.

43 (7) No dental hygienist may partner with more than three dentists utilizing 44 extended access.

45 (8) The hygienist may be assisted by a dental assistant in the performance of the
 46 hygienist's extended access services.

47 (9) The hygienist is required to take an additional six hours of continuing education
48 per licensure renewal period on a topic or topics related to the area of the extended access
49 agreement.

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
