AN ACT

To amend chapter 574, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to unlawful traffic interference, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 574, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 574.045, to read as follows:

574.045. 1. As used in this section, the following terms mean:

2 (1) "Interstate highway", a highway located in this state that is included in the 3 national system of interstate highways, as officially designated or as may be hereafter 4 designated by the Missouri highways and transportation commission within the Missouri 5 department of transportation and approved by the United States Secretary of 6 Transportation;

7 (2) "Unlawful assembly", two or more persons who meet for the purpose of 8 violating any of the criminal laws of this state or of the United States.

9 2. A person commits the offense of unlawful traffic interference if, with the 10 intention to impede vehicular traffic, the person walks, stands, sits, kneels, lays, or places 11 an object in such a manner as to block passage by a vehicle on any public street, highway, 12 or interstate highway. This section shall not apply to the blocking of passage by any 13 person who has permission to do so from a government authority, who is a law 14 enforcement officer, or who does so to direct traffic away from hazardous road conditions, 15 an obstacle, or a scene of an accident.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

3. The offense of unlawful traffic interference on a public street or highway, except an interstate highway, is a class A misdemeanor for the first violation. Any second or subsequent violation that occurs on a public street or highway, except an interstate highway, is a class E felony.

4. The offense of unlawful traffic interference on an interstate highway is a class E felony. For a first violation, the court shall grant a suspended imposition of sentence and impose a term of supervised probation for five years, one hundred hours of community service, and a fine not to exceed seven hundred fifty dollars.

5. The offense of unlawful traffic interference on any public street, highway, or interstate highway while part of an unlawful assembly is a class D felony. For a first violation, the court shall grant a suspended imposition of sentence and impose a term of supervised probation for five years, one hundred hours of community service, and a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars.
