AN ACT

To amend chapters 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 59, and 578, RSMo, by adding thereto seven new sections relating to protection of first responders, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapters 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 59, and 578, RSMo, are amended by adding thereto seven new sections, to be known as sections 51.167, 52.318, 53.008, 54.269, 55.310, 59.665, and 578.710, to read as follows:

- 51.167. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:
- 2 (1) "First responder", the same meaning as defined in section 578.710;
- 3 (2) "Personal information", the same meaning as defined in section 407.1500.
 - 2. Except as provided under subsections 3 and 4 of this section, electronic records retained by a county clerk shall not disclose the home address or any personal information of an active or retired first responder, or use a data element that discloses such person's address or information, if the active or retired first responder notifies the county clerk that he or she wants his or her home address and personal information kept confidential and protected from view by members of the general public.
 - 3. An active or retired first responder may request that the county clerk allow access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section to a designated representative or entity. Such request shall be made in writing to the county clerk.
 - 4. Any person licensed under section 381.115, or such licensee's designated agent, shall have unrestricted access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section.
- 5. The prohibition on information and address disclosure under subsection 2 of this section shall expire upon:
 - (1) The sale of any property subject to an address restriction; or

- 52.318. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:
- (1) "First responder", the same meaning as defined in section 578.710;
 - (2) "Personal information", the same meaning as defined in section 407.1500.
- 2. Except as provided under subsections 3 and 4 of this section, electronic records retained by a county collector shall not disclose the home address or any personal information of an active or retired first responder, or use a data element that discloses such person's address or information, if the active or retired first responder notifies the county collector that he or she wants his or her home address and personal information kept confidential and protected from view by members of the general public.
- 3. An active or retired first responder may request that the county collector allow access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section to a designated representative or entity. Such request shall be made in writing to the county collector.
- 4. Any person licensed under section 381.115, or such licensee's designated agent, shall have unrestricted access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section.
- 5. The prohibition on information and address disclosure under subsection 2 of this section shall expire upon:
 - (1) The sale of any property subject to an address restriction; or
- (2) The death of the active or retired first responder, except that the prohibitions on disclosure shall continue if the active or retired first responder's spouse continues to reside on the property with the address restriction; in such case, the prohibitions on disclosure shall expire upon the death of the first responder's spouse.
 - 53.008. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:
 - (1) "First responder", the same meaning as defined in section 578.710;
- 3 (2) "Personal information", the same meaning as defined in section 407.1500.
 - 2. Except as provided under subsections 3 and 4 of this section, electronic records retained by a county assessor shall not disclose the home address or any personal information of an active or retired first responder, or use a data element that discloses such person's address or information, if the active or retired first responder notifies the county assessor that he or she wants his or her home address and personal information kept confidential and protected from view by members of the general public.

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3. An active or retired first responder may request that the county assessor allow access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section to a designated representative or entity. Such request shall be made in writing to the county assessor.

- 4. Any person licensed under section 381.115, or such licensee's designated agent, shall have unrestricted access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section.
- 5. The prohibition on information and address disclosure under subsection 2 of this section shall expire upon:
 - (1) The sale of any property subject to an address restriction; or
- (2) The death of the active or retired first responder, except that the prohibitions on disclosure shall continue if the active or retired first responder's spouse continues to reside on the property with the address restriction; in such case, the prohibitions on disclosure shall expire upon the death of the first responder's spouse.
 - 54.269. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:
- (1) "First responder", the same meaning as defined in section 578.710;
 - (2) "Personal information", the same meaning as defined in section 407.1500.
- 2. Except as provided under subsections 3 and 4 of this section, electronic records retained by a county treasurer shall not disclose the home address or any personal information of an active or retired first responder, or use a data element that discloses such person's address or information, if the active or retired first responder notifies the county treasurer that he or she wants his or her home address and personal information kept confidential and protected from view by members of the general public.
- 3. An active or retired first responder may request that the county treasurer allow access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section to a designated representative or entity. Such request shall be made in writing to the county treasurer.
- 4. Any person licensed under section 381.115, or such licensee's designated agent, shall have unrestricted access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section.
- 5. The prohibition on information and address disclosure under subsection 2 of this section shall expire upon:
 - (1) The sale of any property subject to an address restriction; or
- (2) The death of the active or retired first responder, except that the prohibitions on disclosure shall continue if the active or retired first responder's spouse continues to reside on the property with the address restriction; in such case, the prohibitions on disclosure shall expire upon the death of the first responder's spouse.
 - 55.310. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:
- 2 (1) "First responder", the same meaning as defined in section 578.710;
- 3 (2) "Personal information", the same meaning as defined in section 407.1500.

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2. Except as provided under subsections 3 and 4 of this section, electronic records retained by a county auditor shall not disclose the home address or any personal information of an active or retired first responder, or use a data element that discloses such 7 person's address or information, if the active or retired first responder notifies the county auditor that he or she wants his or her home address and personal information kept confidential and protected from view by members of the general public.

- 3. An active or retired first responder may request that the county auditor allow access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section to a designated representative or entity. Such request shall be made in writing to the county auditor.
- 4. Any person licensed under section 381.115, or such licensee's designated agent, shall have unrestricted access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section.
- 5. The prohibition on information and address disclosure under subsection 2 of this section shall expire upon:
 - (1) The sale of any property subject to an address restriction; or
- (2) The death of the active or retired first responder, except that the prohibitions on disclosure shall continue if the active or retired first responder's spouse continues to reside on the property with the address restriction; in such case, the prohibitions on disclosure shall expire upon the death of the first responder's spouse.
 - 59.665. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:
- (1) "First responder", the same meaning as defined in section 578.710;
 - (2) "Personal information", the same meaning as defined in section 407.1500.
- 2. Except as provided under subsections 3 and 4 of this section, electronic records retained by a county recorder of deeds shall not disclose the home address or any personal information of an active or retired first responder, or use a data element that discloses such person's address or information, if the active or retired first responder notifies the county recorder of deeds that he or she wants his or her home address and personal information kept confidential and protected from view by members of the general public.
- 3. An active or retired first responder may request that the county recorder of deeds allow access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section to a designated representative or entity. Such request shall be made in writing to the county recorder of deeds.
- 4. Any person licensed under section 381.115, or such licensee's designated agent, shall have unrestricted access to information protected under subsection 2 of this section.
- 16 5. The prohibition on information and address disclosure under subsection 2 of this 17 section shall expire upon:
 - (1) The sale of any property subject to an address restriction; or

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19 (2) The death of the active or retired first responder, except that the prohibitions 20 on disclosure shall continue if the active or retired first responder's spouse continues to 21 reside on the property with the address restriction; in such case, the prohibitions on 22 disclosure shall expire upon the death of the first responder's spouse.

578.710. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:

- (1) "First responder", any peace officer as defined in section 590.010; paid or volunteer firefighter; uniformed employee of the office of the state fire marshal; emergency medical technician; emergency room, hospital, or trauma center personnel; parole officer; probation officer; state correctional employee; water safety officer; park ranger; conservation officer; air ambulance pilot; air ambulance registered professional nurse; air ambulance registered respiratory therapist; or air ambulance flight crew member;
 - (2) "Personal information", the same meaning as defined in section 407.1500.
- 2. A person commits the offense of unlawful posting of personally identifying information over the internet if he or she knowingly posts the name, home address, Social Security number, telephone number, or other personal information of any first responder on the internet intending to cause great bodily harm or death to the first responder or threatening to cause great bodily harm or death to the first responder.
- 3. The offense of unlawful posting of personally identifying information over the internet is a class A misdemeanor.

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
