#### **AN ACT**

To appropriate money for the expenses, grants, refunds, and distributions of the Department of Economic Development, Department of Commerce and Insurance, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations and the several divisions and programs thereof to be expended only as provided in Article IV, Section 28 of the Constitution of Missouri, and to transfer money among certain funds for the period beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

There is appropriated out of the State Treasury, to be expended only as provided in Article IV, Section 28 of the Constitution of Missouri, for the purpose of funding each

- department, division, agency, fund transfer, and program described herein for the item or items
- 4 stated, and for no other purpose whatsoever, chargeable to the fund designated for the period
- 5 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, as follows:

### PART 1

	Section 7.000. Each appropriation in this act shall consist of the item or

11	in Part 2 is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall
12	invalidate all of the appropriations in this act of which said
13	clarification of purpose is a part. An appropriation may be
14	comprised in whole or in part of a one-time amount, and such one-
15	time amount shall be construed to be a component part of, and not
16	in addition to, the stated appropriation amount. Any amount of an
17	appropriation identified as "one-time" in this act shall not be
18	considered an addition to any ongoing core appropriation(s) in
19	future fiscal periods beyond June 30, 2024. Any amount
20	identified as one-time may, however, be requested in any future
21	fiscal period as a new decision item.
