### AN ACT

To repeal section 569.170 as enacted by senate bill no. 491, ninety-seventh general assembly, second regular session and section 569.170 as enacted by senate bill no. 60, seventy-ninth general assembly, first regular session, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to burglary, with penalty provisions.

---

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Section 569.170 as enacted by senate bill no. 491, ninety-seventh general  
2 assembly, second regular session and section 569.170 as enacted by senate bill no. 60, seventy-  
3 ninth general assembly, first regular session, are repealed and one new section enacted in lieu  
4 thereof, to be known as section 569.170, to read as follows:

569.170. 1. A person commits the offense of burglary in the second degree when he or  
2 she knowingly enters unlawfully or knowingly remains unlawfully in a building or inhabitable  
3 structure [for the purpose of committing a crime therein].

4 2. The offense of burglary in the second degree is a class D felony.

569.170. 1. A person commits the crime of burglary in the second degree when he  
2 knowingly enters unlawfully or knowingly remains unlawfully in a building or inhabitable  
3 structure [for the purpose of committing a crime therein].

4 2. Burglary in the second degree is a class C felony.
