

House Concurrent Resolution No. 107

1 **WHEREAS**, an increasing number of radical activists and politicians have called for the
2 abolition of the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE); and

4 **WHEREAS**, ICE was created in the wake of 9/11, which was perpetrated by numerous
5 terrorists who were illegal aliens, for the purpose of enforcing our immigration laws and
6 investigating criminal and terrorist activity of illegal aliens; and

8 **WHEREAS**, ICE has played a significant role in protecting American communities from
9 illegal aliens responsible for drug trafficking, human trafficking, child trafficking, and countless
10 other crimes;

12 **WHEREAS**, ICE has identified or rescued 1,422 victims of sexual exploitation or human
13 trafficking as the result of the activity of illegal aliens; and

14

15 **WHEREAS**, ICE has arrested thousands of aliens who illegally crossed the borders and
16 were responsible for dangerous criminal offenses ranging from drug offenses to assault to
17 homicides; and

19 **WHEREAS**, abolishing ICE would thus severely jeopardize the national security
20 interests of the United States and unnecessarily and recklessly expose American citizens to
21 needless suffering;

23 **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the members of the House of
24 Representatives of the One Hundredth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate
25 concurring therein, hereby denounce all calls for the abolition of ICE; and

27 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the members of the House of Representatives of
28 the One Hundredth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein,
29 hereby urge the Missouri Congressional delegation to oppose any and all Congressional action
30 aimed at abolishing ICE; and

32 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
33 Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for each
34 member of the Missouri Congressional delegation.
