2 3 4	WHEREAS, recent research demonstrates that residents of neighborhoods with substandard housing, abandoned buildings, and vacant lots are more likely than residents of other neighborhoods to suffer from various health problems, such as asthma, neurological damage, and mental illness; and

6 7 8	WHEREAS, studies have shown that household disrepair can lead to psychological dysfunction, lead in the home can lead to neurological damage, and vacant lots and abandoned buildings can lead to isolation, loss of social capital, and violence; and
10 11	WHEREAS, in Philadelphia, renovation of buildings was associated with a reduction in crime, including gun violence; and

13 14 15	WHEREAS, investing in improving the conditions in neighborhoods with substandard housing, abandoned buildings, and vacant lots should be an essential part of the effort to reduce gun violence and improve public health outcomes in our communities; and

17 18 19	WHEREAS, land reutilization programs improve conditions in neighborhoods by acquiring blighted properties and selling them to those who will use the properties to benefit the community; and

21 22 23	WHEREAS, by returning vacant lots and abandoned buildings to productive use, St. Louis City's Land Reutilization Authority may be able to improve public health outcomes for St. Louis City residents; and

2526	WHEREAS, programs like St. Louis City's Land Reutilization Authority need sufficient funding to manage, repair, and stabilize buildings; and

28 29 30	WHEREAS, because purchasers of blighted properties often lack the financial resources required to make needed repairs to the properties, St. Louis City's Land Reutilization Authority cannot solve the problem of urban blight in the city on its own; and

32 33 34	WHEREAS , St. Louis City has not solved its urban blight problem, as evidenced by the fact that in 2020 there were over 200 homicides in the city, which translates to a homicide rate of 87 killings per 100,000 residents; and

363738	WHEREAS, the KC Home Rehabber Loan Fund supports home rehabilitation projects in distressed neighborhoods in Kansas City by providing small contractors with financing in order to rehabilitate homes; and

40 41 42	WHEREAS, the creation of more programs to assist purchasers of blighted properties is needed to address the devastating health impacts of urban blight and gun violence in St. Louis City and in other cities in the state; and

44 45 46	WHEREAS, funding land reutilization programs and programs that assist purchasers of blighted properties will increase the availability of safe, affordable housing and significantly improve health outcomes for residents of this state:

48 49 50 51 52	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the One Hundred First General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby state our support for the funding of land reutilization programs and programs that assist purchasers of blighted properties and urge prioritization of the funding of these programs in order to improve public health outcomes in our state.
