## AN ACT

Relating to sickle cell awareness week.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

WHEREAS, sickle cell disease is an inherited blood disorder that affects red blood cells. People with sickle cell disease have red blood cells that contain an abnormal type of hemoglobin; and

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WHEREAS, normal red blood cells contain hemoglobin A. Hemoglobin S and hemoglobin C are abnormal types of hemoglobin; and

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WHEREAS, red blood cells containing mostly hemoglobin S do not live as long as normal red blood cells and have difficulty passing through the body's small vessels. These hemoglobin S red blood cells can block small blood vessels, resulting in tissue damage due to less blood reaching that portion of the body; and

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WHEREAS, sickle cell trait is an inherited condition in which both hemoglobin A and S are produced in the red blood cells, always more A than S. Sickle cell trait is not a type of sickle cell disease; and

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WHEREAS, sickle cell conditions are inherited from parents in much the same way as blood type, hair color and texture, eye color, and other physical traits. The types of hemoglobin a person makes in their red blood cells depends upon what hemoglobin genes the person inherits from his or her parents; and

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22	WHEREAS, since sickle cell conditions are inherited from parents, it is important for
23	people to be aware if they are a carrier before having children; and
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25	WHEREAS, more than 90,000 people in the United States have sickle cell disease.
26	affecting mostly persons of African heritage according to the National Institute of Health
27	Currently, there is no universal cure for sickle cell disease; and
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29	WHEREAS, sickle cell disease results in a shortened life expectancy, with the
30	average life expectancy being 42 years for men and 48 years for women; and
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32	WHEREAS, based on the population of 6 million in the state of Missouri, 700,000
33	are African American. 1 out of 400 suffers from sickle cell conditions and 1 out of 12 has the
34	sickle cell trait; and
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36	WHEREAS, with these estimated numbers, there are approximately 1,750
37	individuals with sickle cell conditions and 58,000 individuals with the sickle cell trait in
38	the state of Missouri; and

40	WHEREAS, approximately 700 children, adolescents, and young adults with sickle
41 42	cell disease reside in the St. Louis metropolitan area. However, less than 25% of this sickle cell population will graduate from high school or seek higher education; and

44	WHEREAS, health maintenance for persons with sickle cell disease starts with early
45	diagnosis, preferably as a newborn; and

47	WHEREAS, treatment of complications often includes antibiotics, pain management.
48	intravenous fluids, blood transfusions, and surgery in combination with psychosocial supports

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51	WHEREAS, there are promising new treatments being developed which can prevent
52	red blood cells from sickling without causing harm to other parts of the body, reduce the
53	frequency of severe pain and acute chest syndrome, reduce the need for blood transfusions.
54	and provide options to eliminate iron overload caused by repeated blood transfusions; and
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56	WHEREAS, public awareness about sickle cell trait and disease and the numerous
57	programs and screenings available is vital to reduce the pervasiveness of sickle cell
58	conditions:

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NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the One Hundred Second General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby designate the third full week in September as "Sickle Cell Awareness Week" in Missouri; and

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**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the General Assembly encourages and urges all citizens of this state to participate in activities during Sickle Cell Awareness Week to address the pervasiveness of sickle cell trait and disease and the need to increase public awareness of the available programs and screenings; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to the Governor for his approval or rejection pursuant to the Missouri Constitution.
