2	WHEREAS, state government should not be involved in the institution of marriage of in the issuance of marriage licenses; and

4	WHEREAS, our statutes are entrenched with matters relating to marriage including, but
5	not limited to, laws relating to tax, property, family, probate, business, and county government
6	and

8	WHEREAS, a special session is needed in order to properly vet such matters and reform
9	our statutes to remove the state's involvement in marriage; and

11	WHEREAS, under Article III, Section 20(b) of the Constitution of Missouri, the Genera
12	Assembly may call a special session upon filing of a petition with the Secretary of State stating
13	the purpose for which the session is to be called and signed by 3/4 of the members of the Senate
14	and 3/4 of the members of the House of Representatives; and

16	WHEREAS, the General Assembly should have prior notice of such special session in
17	order to conduct research and draft legislation; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, the General Assembly should agree to reconvene in a special session in
20	September 2017, concurrent with the veto session, in order to explore this issue:

22	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of
23	Representatives of the Ninety-ninth General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate
24	concurring therein, hereby agree to file a joint proclamation calling for a special session of the
25	General Assembly in September 2017, for the purpose of discussing the state's involvement in
26	the institution of marriage; and

28	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
20	Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed convert this resolution for each
