## **AN ACT**

Relating to lupus awareness month and lupus awareness day.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

WHEREAS, lupus is a complex and debilitating autoimmune disease that can cause inflammation and tissue damage to organ systems in the body, including the skin, joints, other

- 3 connective tissue, blood and blood vessels, heart, lungs, kidney, and brain; and
- WHEREAS, approximately 1,500,000 to 2,000,000 Americans live with some form of lupus.
- WHEREAS, lupus affects women nine times more often than men, and 80 percent of newly diagnosed cases of lupus develop among women of child bearing age; and
- 8 **WHEREAS**, lupus disproportionately affects women of color and is generally more 9 prevalent in minority populations; a health disparity that remains unexplained.
- WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the rate of lupus mortality has increased since the late 1970s and is higher among older African-American women; and
- WHEREAS, there have been no new drugs approved by the federal Food and Drug
  Administration for lupus in nearly 40 years, and current treatments, while usually effective, have
  many damaging side effects; and
- WHEREAS, pain and fatigue associated with lupus threatens the ability to live independently and make it difficult to maintain employment and lead normal lives.

WHEREAS, one in five people diagnosed with lupus is disabled by the disease, and, as a consequence, receives support from government programs, including Medicare, Medicaid, Social Security Disability, and Supplemental Security Income; and

- WHEREAS, the estimated average annual cost of medical treatment for an individual with lupus is \$10,000 at a minimum and can greatly exceed that amount for individuals with more serious forms of lupus, thus causing a significant economic, emotional, and social burden to families and society; and
- WHEREAS, lupus is difficult to diagnose and can lead to several years of visiting multiple physicians before individuals can obtain an accurate diagnosis; and
- WHEREAS, early diagnosis of and treatment for lupus can prevent or reduce serious organ damage, disability, and death; and
- WHEREAS, despite the impact of lupus on individuals, families, and health professionals, public understanding of lupus is very limited. Only one in five Americans can provide even basic information about lupus, and awareness of lupus is lowest among adults ages 18 to 34 years, the age group most likely to develop symptoms of lupus; and
- WHEREAS, lupus is a significant national health issue that deserves a comprehensive and coordinated response by federal and state governments with the involvement of health care providers, patients with lupus, and public health communities:
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the One Hundredth General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby designate the month of May each year as "Lupus Awareness Month" and May 10 of each year as "Lupus Awareness Day" in the state of Missouri; and
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the citizens of Missouri are encouraged to participate in appropriate events and activities that raise awareness about the diagnosis and treatment of lupus and its impact on the lives of individuals living with lupus; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to the Governor for his approval or rejection pursuant to the Missouri Constitution.

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
