## **AN ACT**

Relating to the designation of Missouri No Smoking/No Tobacco Day.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

**WHEREAS**, on May 15, 1987, the World Health Organization (WHO) passed a resolution calling for April 7, 1988, to be the first "World No Smoking Day", a date chosen because it was the 40th anniversary of the WHO; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 17, 1989, the World Health Organization passed a resolution calling for May 31st to be annually known as "World No Tobacco Day", which has been observed each year since 1989; and

WHEREAS, medical research made it clear during the 1900s that to bacco use increased the likelihood of many illnesses, including heart attacks, strokes, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), emphysema, and many forms of cancer; and

WHEREAS, the aim of a no smoking/no tobacco day is to inform the public about the dangers of using tobacco and is a day for people, nongovernmental organizations, and governments to organize and conduct various activities to increase awareness about such dangers; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the members of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-ninth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby designate May 31st each year to be "Missouri No Smoking/ No

25 Tobacco Day" to be held in conjunction with the "World No Tobacco Day" to increase awareness 26 about the negative effects of tobacco use on our citizens, families, friends, and communities; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the citizens of this state are encouraged to observe 29 the day with appropriate events and activities aimed at preventing people from starting tobacco 30 use and assisting those who currently use tobacco in learning not only how but why it is vitally 31 important to stop their tobacco use; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to the Governor for his approval or rejection pursuant to the Missouri Constitution. 34
