AN ACT

Relating to lupus awareness month and lupus awareness day.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

WHEREAS, lupus is a complex and debilitating autoimmune disease that can cause 2 inflammation and tissue damage to organ systems in the body, including the skin, joints, other 3 connective tissue, blood and blood vessels, heart, lungs, kidneys, and brain; and 4 5 WHEREAS, approximately 1,500,000 to 2,000,000 Americans live with some form 6 of lupus; and 7 8 WHEREAS, lupus affects women nine times more often than men, and 80 percent of 9 newly diagnosed cases of lupus develop among women of childbearing age; and 10 11 WHEREAS, lupus disproportionately affects women of color and is generally more prevalent in minority populations, a health disparity that remains unexplained; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the rate of lupus mortality has increased since the late 1970s and is higher among older African-15 American women; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, there have been no new drugs approved by the federal Food and Drug 19 Administration for lupus in nearly 40 years, and current treatments, while usually effective, 20 have many damaging side effects; and 21

22 WHEREAS, pain and fatigue associated with lupus threaten the ability to live independently and make it difficult to maintain employment and lead normal lives; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, one in five people diagnosed with lupus is disabled by the disease and, 26 as a consequence, receives support from government programs, including Medicare, 27 Medicaid, Social Security Disability, and Supplemental Security Income; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the estimated average annual cost of medical treatment for an individual with lupus is \$10,000 at a minimum and can greatly exceed that amount for individuals with 30 more serious forms of lupus, thus causing a significant economic, emotional, and social 31 32 burden to families and society; and 33 34 WHEREAS, lupus is difficult to diagnose and can lead to several years of visiting 35 multiple physicians before individuals obtain an accurate diagnosis; and 36 37 WHEREAS, early diagnosis of and treatment for lupus can prevent or reduce serious 38 organ damage, disability, and death; and 39 40 WHEREAS, despite the impact of lupus on individuals, families, and health 41 professionals, public understanding of lupus is very limited. Only one in five Americans can 42 provide even basic information about lupus, and awareness of lupus is lowest among adults 43 ages 18 to 34 years, the age group most likely to develop symptoms of lupus; and 44 45 WHEREAS, lupus is a significant national health issue that deserves a comprehensive and coordinated response by federal and state governments with the 46 47 involvement of health care providers, patients with lupus, and public health communities: 48 49 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the One Hundred First General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the 50 Senate concurring therein, hereby designate the month of May each year as "Lupus 51 Awareness Month" and May 10 of each year as "Lupus Awareness Day" in the state of 52 53 Missouri; and 54 55 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the citizens of Missouri are encouraged to 56 participate in appropriate events and activities that raise awareness about the diagnosis and 57 treatment of lupus and its impact on the lives of individuals living with lupus; and

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59 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this resolution be sent to the Governor for his 60 approval or rejection pursuant to the Missouri Constitution.
