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2	WHEREAS , motorcycle ridership has continued to increase over time, with registrations growing from 3,826,373 in 1997 to 8,600,936 in 2015; and
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4 5 6	WHEREAS , as of August, 2016, the ongoing National Motorcycle Profiling Survey 2016, conducted by the Motorcycle Profiling Project, found that approximately one-half of the motorcyclists surveyed felt that they had been profiled by law enforcement at least once; and
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8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, motorcycle profiling means the illegal use of the fact that a person rides a motorcycle or wears motorcycle related apparel as a factor in deciding to stop and question, take enforcement action, arrest, or search a person or vehicle, with or without legal basis under the Constitution of the United States; and
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13 14	WHEREAS, complaints surrounding motorcycle profiling have been cited in all fifty states; and
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16 17	WHEREAS , nationwide protests to raise awareness and combat motorcycle profiling have been held in multiple states:
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19 20 21	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the One Hundredth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby:
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23	(1) Support increased public awareness on the issue of motorcycle profiling;

(2) Encourage collaboration and communication with the motorcycle community and

(3) Urge law enforcement officials to include statements condemning motorcycle

law enforcement to engage in efforts to end motorcycle profiling; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for each law enforcement agency in the state of Missouri.

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
