

# House Concurrent Resolution No. 78

## 99TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE LOVE.

1           **WHEREAS**, the relationship between the United States and Cuba has been marked by  
2 tension, hostility, confrontation, and a fifty-plus year U.S. trade embargo that remains the longest  
3 standing embargo in modern history; and

4  
5           **WHEREAS**, Cuba imports more than one billion dollars worth of food every year,  
6 including approximately 1.25 million tons of wheat, 500,000 tons of rice, 50,000 tons of poultry,  
7 and 75,000 tons of dairy products; and

8  
9           **WHEREAS**, Cuba's imports are expected to grow significantly as Cuba slowly recovers  
10 from the severe economic recession it has endured following the withdrawal of subsidies from  
11 the former Soviet Union; and

13           **WHEREAS**, agriculture is the largest industry in Missouri and a leading employer of  
14 Missourians; and

15  
16           **WHEREAS**, Missouri ranks among the top ten states in production of many agricultural  
17 commodities, including soybeans, corn, and pork; and

18  
19           **WHEREAS**, Missouri ranks eleventh among all states in the overall value of its  
20 agricultural exports at approximately 4 billion dollars annually; and

22           **WHEREAS**, since the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act (TSRA)  
23 was implemented in 2000, the United States has exported nearly \$5 billion worth of agricultural  
24 products to Cuba; and

26           **WHEREAS**, the United States market share has recently declined due to increased  
27 competition from countries that can provide favorable credit terms that the United States is  
28 prohibited from offering and the prohibition against providing market development assistance  
29 under the TSRA; and

31           **WHEREAS**, Missouri is positioned to benefit from the market opportunities that free  
32 trade with Cuba would provide due to our agricultural abundance, transportation infrastructure,  
33 and the consumer needs of the people of Cuba; and

35           **WHEREAS**, rather than depriving Cuba of agricultural products, the United States  
36 embargo only succeeds in driving sales to competitors in other countries that have no such  
37 restrictions; and

39           **WHEREAS**, the trade restrictions of the United States against Cuba hinder Missouri's  
40 export of agricultural and food products; and

42           **WHEREAS**, full liberalization of trade between the United States and Cuba would  
43 enable United States agricultural exports to compete on a more level playing field by allowing  
44 the use of credit facilities, export and technical assistance, and market development programs:

46           **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the members of the House of  
47 Representatives of the Ninety-ninth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate  
48 concurring therein, hereby urge the United States Congress to consider the removal of trade  
49 restrictions relating to Cuba and work to restore trade relations between the United States and  
50 Cuba; and

52           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of  
53 Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the  
54 President of the United States, the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States,  
55 the President Pro Tempore of the United States Senate, and to all members of the Missouri  
56 Congressional delegation.
