

# House Concurrent Resolution No. 80

## 99TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

2           **WHEREAS**, in 1983 President Reagan designated November as National Alzheimer's  
3 Disease Awareness Month; and

4           **WHEREAS**, there are more than 5 million people with Alzheimer's disease in the  
5 United States and 35 million worldwide; and

6  
7           **WHEREAS**, Alzheimer's disease is the 6<sup>th</sup> leading cause of death in the United States  
8 and in the state of Missouri; and

9  
10           **WHEREAS**, there has been an 85% increase in Alzheimer's deaths in the state of  
11 Missouri since 2000; and

12  
13           **WHEREAS**, the state of Missouri is host to several walks and other fundraising events  
14 that bring attention to the care, support, and research for Alzheimer's disease; and

15  
16           **WHEREAS**, Alzheimer's disease is more likely to affect Americans as they grow older,  
17 although genetics can also play a role, age is the most significant risk factor. But Alzheimer's  
18 touches many more individuals than simply those who are diagnosed; and

19  
20           **WHEREAS**, in 2015, in the state of Missouri, more than 300,000 caregivers provided  
21 over 357 million hours of unpaid care; and

23           **WHEREAS**, in 2016, Alzheimer's and other dementias will cost the nation 236 billion  
24 dollars; and

26           **WHEREAS**, by 2020, there will be an estimated 120,000 people aged 65 and older with  
27 Alzheimer's disease:

29           **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the members of the House of  
30 Representatives of the Ninety-ninth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate  
31 concurring therein, hereby designates the month of November as Alzheimer’s Awareness Month  
32 in the state of Missouri; and

34           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the General Assembly recommends to the citizens  
35 of this state to observe the month by learning more about Alzheimer’s disease and support the  
36 individuals living with this disease and their caregivers.
