

# House Concurrent Resolution No. 92

**WHEREAS**, under Article V of the Constitution of the United States:

3       “The Congress, whenever two thirds of both houses shall deem it necessary, shall propose  
4 amendments to this Constitution, or, on the application of the legislatures of two thirds of the  
5 several states, shall call a convention for proposing amendments, which, in either case, shall be  
6 valid to all intents and purposes, as part of this Constitution, when ratified by the legislatures of  
7 three fourths of the several states, or by conventions in three fourths thereof, as the one or the  
8 other mode of ratification may be proposed by the Congress; provided that no amendment which  
9 may be made prior to the year one thousand eight hundred and eight shall in any manner affect  
10 the first and fourth clauses in the ninth section of the first article; and that no state, without its  
11 consent, shall be deprived of its equal suffrage in the Senate.”; and

13       **WHEREAS**, the following Amendment to the Constitution of the United States is  
14 proposed:

16       “Section 1. That to be valid and recognized in this country, a marriage shall exist only  
17 between a man and a woman.”:

19       **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the members of the House of  
20 Representatives of the Ninety-ninth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate  
21 concurring therein, hereby submit this resolution for an amendment to the Constitution of the  
22 United States and, under Article V of the Constitution of the United States, respectfully urge the  
23 United States Congress to submit the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United  
24 States for ratification and inclusion in the United States Constitution; and

26       **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of  
27 Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the  
28 Majority and Minority Leaders of the United States Senate and House of Representatives, and  
29 each member of the Missouri Congressional delegation.
