2 3	WHEREAS , the Missouri state capitol shall be freely open to the public to peacefully assemble, to petition their government, and to observe all sessions of the general assembly; and
4 5	WHEREAS , in 2002 metal detectors were installed at the state capitol after the September 11 attacks but were taken down in 2003; and
6 7 8 9	WHEREAS , the state spent more than \$415,000 to buy and install the new security equipment that is presently in use at the capitol building; and
10 11	WHEREAS , the state capitol has two metal detectors located at two of the three public entrances; and
12 13 14 15	WHEREAS , the expense of one metal detector will cost the state taxpayers over \$71,000 each year, with a total of \$142,000 each year; and
16 17 18	WHEREAS, that expense does not include the payroll of the security personnel who sit at each entrance and conduct security screenings on those entering the capitol; and
19 20 21	WHEREAS , Governor Greitens recently announced \$146.4 million of spending restrictions because the Missouri budget is suffering from reduced revenue and poor economic growth; and
22232425	WHEREAS, the cessation of unnecessary spending on security measures at the state capitol will assist in getting Missouri toward the goal of a balanced budget:
