2	WHEREAS, millions of Syrians are fleeing their homes due to violence, the deaths of loved ones, and failing health care and education systems; and
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4	WHEREAS, the Syrian refugee crisis provides an opportunity for terrorists to hide
5	their operatives among the refugees settling in the United States and other countries; and
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7	WHEREAS, the screening process in the United States for refugees cannot guarantee
8	that no terrorist will settle in the United States; and
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10	WHEREAS, the recent terrorist attacks in Paris highlight the threat of terrorist
11	attacks; and
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13	WHEREAS, the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS), as the apparent perpetrator of
14 15	the Paris terrorist attacks, appears to be broadening its focus to include attacks against Western countries; and
16	western countries, and
17	WHEREAS, the United States could be the next target for ISIS terrorists; and
18	WHEREAS, the Officed States could be the field target for 1515 terrorists, and
19	WHEREAS, the United States should seek to prevent such terrorist attacks; and
20	WHEREAS, the Office States should seek to prevent such terrorist attacks, and
21	WHEREAS, the female terrorist in San Bernardino entered the United States through
22	a visa program that failed to discover her sympathies with terrorist groups even though she
23	had been radicalized for a long period of time before the attack in San Bernardino; and
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25	WHEREAS, stopping the flow of Syrian refugees into the United States may prevent
26	ISIS terrorists from arriving in the United States; and
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28	WHEREAS, stopping the flow of Syrian refugees into the United States may prevent
29	a terrorist attack on American soil; and
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31 32 33	WHEREAS, states have the power to regulate immigration under the tenth amendment of the United States Constitution because the power to regulate immigration has not been expressly delegated to the United States Congress; and
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35 36 37 38 39	WHEREAS , Chief Justice John Roberts recently stated in <i>National Federation of Independent Business v. Sebelius</i> , 132 S. Ct. 2566 (2012), that "(p)ermitting the Federal Government to force the States to implement a federal program would threaten the political accountability key to our federal system"; and
40 41 42 43	WHEREAS , Chief Justice Roberts also noted, in the <i>Sebelius</i> case, that the Supreme Court of the United States has struck down "federal legislation that commandeers a State's legislative or administrative apparatus for federal purposes"; and
44 45 46 47	WHEREAS, Chief Justice Roberts concluded in the <i>Sebelius</i> case that the United States Congress could not "penalize States that choose not to participate in that new program (Medicaid expansion) by taking away their existing Medicaid funding"; and
48 49 50	WHEREAS, the federal government does not have the authority to compel states to accept refugees into their states:
51 52 53 54 55	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-eighth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby declare that no Syrian refugees shall enter Missouri and no state funding shall support any Syrian refugees; and
56 57 58	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for each member of the Missouri Congressional delegation.
