JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri an amendment repealing Section 39(e) of Article III of the Constitution of Missouri, and adopting one new section in lieu thereof relating to excursion gambling boats.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring therein:

That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2022, or at a special election to be called by the governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of this state, for adoption or rejection, the following amendment to Article III of the Constitution of the state of Missouri:

Section A. Section 39(e), Article III, Constitution of Missouri, is repealed and one new 2 section adopted in lieu thereof, to be known as Section 39(e), to read as follows:

Section 39(e). The general assembly is authorized to permit upon or along the Mississippi and Missouri Rivers only, which shall include [artificial] spaces [that contain water 2 and] that are within [1000] one thousand feet of the closest edge of the [main channel] high 3 4 water mark of either of those rivers, lotteries, gift enterprises, and games of chance to be conducted [on excursion gambling boats and floating] within gaming facilities. Any license 5 issued before or after the adoption date of this amendment for any excursion gambling boat or 6 floating facility located in any such artificial space shall be deemed to be authorized by the 7 8 General Assembly and to be in compliance with this Section.
