### JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri an amendment repealing section 40(a) of article IV of the Constitution of Missouri, and adopting one new section in lieu thereof relating to conservation commission membership.

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring therein:* 

That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2018, or at a special election to be called by the 2 3 governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of this state, for 4 adoption or rejection, the following amendment to article IV of the Constitution of the state of

Missouri: 5

Section A. Section 40(a), article IV, Constitution of Missouri, is repealed and one new section adopted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 40(a), to read as follows: 2

Section 40(a). The control, management, restoration, conservation and regulation of the bird, fish, game, forestry and all wildlife resources of the state, including hatcheries, sanctuaries, 2 refuges, reservations and all other property owned, acquired or used for such purposes and the 3 4 acquisition and establishment thereof, and the administration of all laws pertaining thereto, shall be vested in a conservation commission consisting of [four] ten members as follows: six 5 members shall be appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, 6 not more than [two] three of whom shall be of the same political party; two members shall be 7 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives with one member from the 8 9 majority party and one member from the minority party; and two members shall be appointed by the president pro tempore of the senate with one member from the majority 10 11 party and one member from the minority party. The members shall have knowledge of and

12 interest in wildlife conservation. The members shall hold office for terms of six years beginning

13 on the first day of July of consecutive odd years. Two of the terms shall be concurrent; one shall 14 begin two years before and one two years after the concurrent terms. If the governor fails to fill

begin two years before and one two years after the concurrent terms. If the governor fails to fill a vacancy within thirty days, the remaining members shall fill the vacancy for the unexpired

16 term. The term of each member of the general assembly shall continue during the

17 member's term of office or until a successor has been appointed to fill the member's place

18 when his or her term of office as a member of the general assembly has expired. The

19 members shall receive no salary or other compensation for their services as members, but shall

20 receive their necessary traveling and other expenses incurred while actually engaged in the

21 discharge of their official duties.
