WHEREAS, people of color in the United States are disproportionately more often 2 the victims of shootings, chokeholds, and other uses of excessive force by law enforcement officers; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, police brutality and the use of excessive force by law enforcement officers are among the most serious ongoing human rights and civil liberties violations in the 7 United States; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the use of excessive force during an arrest or investigatory stop 10 constitutes an unreasonable seizure under the Fourth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which guarantees the right of every person in the United States to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures at the hands of law enforcement officers; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, the use of excessive force during a period of pretrial detention constitutes the deprivation of due process under the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments to the Constitution of the United States, which guarantee the right of every person in the United 16 States to be free from arbitrary interference with the liberty of that person at the hands of law 17 18 enforcement officers; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the use of excessive force during a term of imprisonment constitutes the use of cruel and unusual punishment under the Eighth Amendment to the Constitution of the 21 United States, which guarantees the right of every person in the United States to be free from 23 cruel and unusual punishment at the hands of law enforcement officers; and

WHEREAS, the rule of law in the United States and in the state of Missouri is undermined when law enforcement officers engage in conduct inconsistent with the Constitution of the United States: and

WHEREAS, it is a fundamental principle of a democratic society that law an enforcement officers should be held to account for their actions; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to focus attention upon legislation to address violence committed by law enforcement and to address law enforcement officer accountability:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the One Hundred Second General Assembly, Second Regular Session, hereby urge a commitment to addressing police violence, particularly against people of color, and ensuring that law enforcement officers who engage in misconduct, discrimination, or inappropriate use of force are held accountable for their actions; and

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the Speaker of the Missouri House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Missouri Senate, and each member of the Missouri General Assembly.
