	WHEREAS, the University of Missouri-Columbia has a long tradition of athletic
2	achievement in many sports and is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association
3	(NCAA); and
4	
5	WHEREAS, student-athletes at Mizzou spend countless hours maintaining a balance at
6	achieving both academic and athletic excellence and should be commended for their dedication
7	and work ethic; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, the athletic department at Mizzou became aware of irregularities involving
10	a tutor for some of the student-athletes; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, in response to such awareness, the athletic department and administration
13	immediately ended any association with the tutor and began an internal investigation and
14	engaged in a joint investigation with the NCAA; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, the athletic department was open and forthright with both the NCAA and
17	the Southeastern Conference about the allegations; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, unlike other member institutions of the NCAA, Mizzou did not try to
20	obstruct the NCAA investigation and, in fact, cooperated fully with the NCAA; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, there was no evidence in the resulting NCAA investigation that any
23	administrator or university personnel in any way pressured the tutor into completing the student-
24	athletes' work. Rather, the tutor acted of her own accord, and the NCAA report said as much
25	when it indicated that "Missouri did the right thing" in cooperating with its investigation and
26	found fault with the tutor, who received a ten-year show-cause penalty; and

28	WHEREAS, despite the lack of any evidence of systemic problems in the athletic
29	department and having the full cooperation and openness of the University, the NCAA Division
30	I Committee on Infractions handed down a disproportionate penalty to the University of

31	Missouri's football, baseball, and softball programs, including a ban on postseason play for their
32	upcoming seasons as well as limitations on scholarships and recruiting and vacation of some
33	wins and records; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, the penalty is inconsistent and arbitrary when compared with the penalties
36	handed down to other member institutions for far worse offenses and where the institution did
37	not cooperate with the investigation; and
38	
39	WHEREAS, this unjust and harsh penalty demonstrates the continued erosion of the
40	credibility of the NCAA as a governing body for collegiate athletics; and
41	
42	WHEREAS, if this unjust and harsh penalty is not reversed upon appeal by the
43	University of Missouri, then serious questions should be asked about the continued need for the
44	NCAA; and
45	
46	WHEREAS, because of these onerous, unfair, and overly punitive sanctions, student-
47	athletes who were not at fault in the least for the actions of the tutor will be the ones to suffer the
48	punishment and deleterious effect on their collegiate athletic careers; and
49	
50	WHEREAS, the decision of the NCAA tells other collegiate programs that doing the
51	right thing and cooperating with an investigation should be the last resort; and

53	WHEREAS, the decision will erode what little faith many people had left in the ability
54	of the NCAA to oversee collegiate athletics; and

56	WHEREAS, it is the duty of this body to speak out and demand the NCAA reverse its
57	decision regarding the University of Missouri:

59	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we, the members of the Missouri House
60	of Representatives, One Hundredth General Assembly, First Regular Session, hereby remonstrate
61	against the NCAA for its unfair and harsh sanctioning of the athletic department of the
62	University of Missouri-Columbia; and

64	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
65	Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for Mark

66 Emmert, President of the NCAA.
