To repeal section 227.100, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to valuation of bids for state contracts.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 227.100, RSMo, is repealed and one new

- 2 section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 227.100,
- 3 to read as follows:

227.100. 1. All contracts for the construction of

2 said work shall be let to the lowest responsible bidder or

3 bidders after notice and publication of an advertisement in

4 a newspaper published in the county where the work is to be

5 done, and in such other publications as the commission may

6 determine. In determining the lowest responsible bidder or

7 bidders, the department of transportation shall consider the

8 complete life-cycle cost of the work, including but not

9 limited to factors such as initial cost and all anticipated

10 costs for subsequent maintenance, repair, or resurfacing

11 over the life of the work. The department of transportation

12 shall develop and implement a life-cycle cost analysis for

13 any project for which the estimated total pavement costs

14 exceed one million dollars funded in whole or in part with

15 state funds. The department of transportation shall design

16 each such project in both hot mix asphalt and portland

17 cement concrete pavement, and shall award paving projects

18 utilizing the material having the lowest life-cycle cost.

19 The design of hot mix asphalt and portland cement concrete

20 pavement methods and life-cycle cost analysis shall be

- 21 conducted in accordance with the department of
- 22 transportation's currently established practices and
- 23 policies.
- 2. Each bid shall be accompanied by a certified check 25 or a cashier's check or a bid bond, guaranteed by a surety
- 26 company authorized by the director of the department of
- 27 commerce and insurance to conduct surety business in the
- 28 state of Missouri, equal to five percent of the bid, which
- 29 certified check, cashier's check, or bid bond shall be
- 30 deposited with the commissioner as a quaranty and forfeited
- 31 to the state treasurer to the credit of the state road fund
- 32 in the event the successful bidder fails to comply with the
- 33 terms of the proposal, and return to the successful bidder
- 34 on execution and delivery of the performance bond provided
- 35 for in subsection 4. The checks of the unsuccessful bidders
- 36 shall be returned to them in accordance with the terms of
- 37 the proposal.
- 38 3. All notices of the letting of contracts under this
- 39 section shall state the time and place when and where bids
- 40 will be received and opened, and all bids shall be sealed
- 41 and opened only at the time and place mentioned in such
- 42 notice and in the presence of some member of the commission
- 43 or some person named by the commission for such purpose.
- 4. The successful bidders for the construction of said
- 45 work shall enter into contracts furnished and prescribed by
- 46 the commission and shall give good and sufficient bond, in a
- 47 sum equal to the contract price, to the state of Missouri,
- 48 with sureties approved by the commission and to ensure the
- 49 proper and prompt completion of said work in accordance with
- 50 the provisions of said contracts, and plans and

specifications; provided, that if, in the opinion of the 51 majority of the members of the commission, the lowest bid or 52 bids for the construction of any of the roads, or parts of 53 roads, herein authorized to be constructed, shall be 54 55 excessive, then, and in that event, said commission shall 56 have the right, and it is hereby empowered and authorized to reject any or all bids, and to construct, under its own 57 direction and supervision, all of such roads and bridges, or 58 59 any part thereof.
