AN ACT

To amend chapter 620, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to programs administered by the department of economic development.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 620, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 620.3200, to read as follows:

620.3200. 1. There is hereby created a task force, to be known as the "Missouri Task Force on Workforce Competitiveness", which shall $\mathbf{2}$ consist of the chairperson of the jobs, economic development, and local 3 government committee of the Missouri senate, a member of the jobs, 4 $\mathbf{5}$ economic development, and local government committee of the Missouri senate appointed by the minority leader of the Missouri senate, the 6 7 chairperson of the economic development and business attraction and retention committee of the Missouri house of representatives, a member 8 of the economic development and business attraction and retention 9 10 committee of the Missouri house of representatives appointed by the minority leader of the Missouri house of representatives, the director 11 of the department of economic development or his or her designee, and 1213 two members to be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate. 14

15 2. The duties of the task force shall include, but are not limited
16 to, the following:

(1) Identifying the necessary components to produce an effective
 and responsive statewide workforce development system that is
 customer-service driven and responsive to the needs of employers and

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20 job seekers;

(2) Defining the state of "Missouri's workforce vision"; the type
of system desired by the business community and job seekers; the
system qualities that are valued; and the outcomes to be achieved;

(3) Assessing the competitive environment, including relevant
state and national economic, employment, occupational and educational
trends and the overall quality of the Missouri workforce;

(4) Developing and understanding the current system, including
its efficiency and effectiveness, its strengths and weaknesses and
opportunities for improvement;

30 (5) Researching the best practices of workforce development
 31 systems in other states;

(6) Developing an understanding and assessment of the statewide
capacity of workforce development services, including programs
offered, administrative funds, training funds, and administrative and
government structures;

36 (7) Recommending strategies to achieve the Missouri workforce vision by creating an organizational structure and system of funding 37that includes one point of contact to better enable employers and 3839 workers to gain easy access to workforce training, prioritizing demand driven workforce needs and resources in support of economic 40 development efforts of the state, establishing appropriate 41 42accountability measures, and including secondary and post-secondary education efforts into a cohesive talent pipeline that meets the needs 43 of industry in Missouri. 44

3. The task force may hold hearings as it deems advisable and may obtain any input or information necessary to fulfill its obligations. The committee may make reasonable requests for staff assistance from the research and appropriations staffs of the house and senate and the committee on legislative research, as well as the department of economic development.

51 4. The task force shall prepare a final report, together with its 52 recommendations for any legislative action deemed necessary, for the 53 submission to the general assembly by December 31, 2017, at which

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54 time the task force shall be dissolved.

55 5. Members of the committee shall receive no compensation but

56 may be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses associated

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57 $\,$ with the performance of their official duties.
