## AN ACT

To amend chapter 208, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the supplemental nutrition assistance program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

	Section A. Chapter 208, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto
2	one new section, to be known as section 208.246, to read as
3	follows:
	208.246. 1. In order to be eligible to participate in
2	the supplemental nutrition assistance program, an individual
3	shall comply with the work requirements described in 7
4	U.S.C. Section 2015(d) and 7 CFR 273.7, unless such
5	individual is otherwise exempt from such requirements under
6	7 U.S.C. Section 2015(d)(2) and 7 CFR 273.7(b).
7	2. A nonexempt individual who refuses or fails without
8	good cause, as such term is described in 7 CFR 273.7, to
9	comply with the program's work requirements shall be
10	ineligible to participate in the program for the duration of
11	the disqualification period and shall be considered an
12	ineligible household member. The disqualification period
13	shall be as follows:
14	(1) For the first occurrence of noncompliance, the
15	individual shall be disqualified for three months;
16	(2) For the second occurrence of noncompliance, the
17	individual shall be disqualified for six months; and

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18 (3) For the third occurrence of noncompliance, the 19 individual shall be disqualified permanently.

If an individual who is the head of a household, as 20 3. such term is described in 7 CFR 273.1, becomes disqualified 21 under this section, the entire household shall be ineligible 22 23 to participate in the program for a period not to exceed the lesser of either the duration of the ineligibility period of 24 25 the disqualified individual or one hundred and eighty days. 26 A household disqualified under this subsection may 27 reestablish eligibility if:

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The head of the household leaves the household; (1) 29 A new and eligible individual joins the household (2) as the head of the household; or 30

31 (3) The head of the household becomes exempt from the 32 program's work requirements during the disqualification 33 period.

If the disqualified head of the household joins another 34 household as its head, that household shall be disqualified 35 36 from participating in the program for the remaining disqualification period. 37

38 4. Except in cases of permanent disqualification, an 39 individual may resume participation in the program at the 40 end of a disqualification period if the individual applies 41 again and is in compliance with the program's work requirements. A disqualified individual may be permitted to 42 43 resume participation during the disqualification period by 44 becoming exempt from the program's work requirements.

45 5. An individual disqualified under the provisions of this section shall be entitled to a fair hearing under 7 CFR 46 273.7(f) and section 208.080. 47

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The department of social services may promulgate 48 6. rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this 49 section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is 50 defined in section 536.010, that is created under the 51 authority delegated in this section shall become effective 52 53 only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 54 55 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and 56 if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective 57 date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently 58 held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking 59 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 60 2021, shall be invalid and void. 61

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
