AN ACT

To repeal sections 302.130 and 302.178, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to the operation of motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

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Section A. Sections 302.130 and 302.178, RSMo, are repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 302.130 and 302.178, to read as follows:

1. Any person at least fifteen years of age

who, except for age or lack of instruction in operating a motor vehicle, would otherwise be qualified to obtain a

4 license pursuant to sections 302.010 to 302.340 may apply

5 for and the director shall issue a temporary instruction

6 permit entitling the applicant, while having such permit in

7 the applicant's immediate possession, to drive a motor

8 vehicle of the appropriate class upon the highways for a

9 period of twelve months, but any such person, except when

10 operating a motorcycle or motortricycle, must be accompanied

11 by a licensed operator for the type of motor vehicle being

12 operated who is actually occupying a seat beside the driver

13 for the purpose of giving instruction in driving the motor

14 vehicle, who is at least twenty-one years of age, and in the

15 case of any driver under sixteen years of age, the licensed

16 operator occupying the seat beside the driver shall be a

17 grandparent, parent, guardian, a person who is at least

18 twenty-five years of age who has been licensed for a minimum

19 of three years and has received written permission from the 20 parent or legal quardian to escort or accompany the driver, 21 a driver training instructor holding a valid driver education endorsement on a teaching certificate issued by 22 23 the department of elementary and secondary education or a 24 qualified instructor of a private drivers' education program who has a valid driver's license. An applicant for a 25 26 temporary instruction permit shall successfully complete a vision test and a test of the applicant's ability to 27 28 understand highway signs which regulate, warn or direct traffic and practical knowledge of the traffic laws of this 29 state, pursuant to section 302.173. In addition, beginning 30 31 January 1, 2007, no permit shall be granted pursuant to this subsection unless a parent or legal quardian gives written 32 permission by signing the application and in so signing, 33 state they, or their designee as set forth in subsection 2 34 of this section, will provide a minimum of forty hours of 35 behind-the-wheel driving instruction, including a minimum of 36 37 ten hours of behind-the-wheel driving instruction that occurs during the nighttime hours falling between sunset and 38 sunrise. The forty hours of behind-the-wheel driving 39 instruction that is completed pursuant to this subsection 40 may include any time that the holder of an instruction 41 42 permit has spent operating a motor vehicle in a driver training program taught by a driver training instructor 43 44 holding a valid driver education endorsement on a teaching 45 certificate issued by the department of elementary and secondary education or by a qualified instructor of a 46 private drivers' education program. If the applicant for a 47 permit is enrolled in a federal residential job training 48 program, the instructor, as defined in subsection 5 of this 49 section, is authorized to sign the application stating that 50

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51 the applicant will receive the behind-the-wheel driving
52 instruction required by this section.

- 2. In the event the parent, grandparent or guardian of the person under sixteen years of age has a physical disability which prohibits or disqualifies said parent, grandparent or guardian from being a qualified licensed operator pursuant to this section, said parent, grandparent or quardian may designate a maximum of two individuals authorized to accompany the applicant for the purpose of giving instruction in driving the motor vehicle. An authorized designee must be a licensed operator for the type of motor vehicle being operated and have attained twenty-one years of age. At least one of the designees must occupy the seat beside the applicant while giving instruction in driving the motor vehicle. The name of the authorized designees must be provided to the department of revenue by the parent, grandparent or guardian at the time of application for the temporary instruction permit. The name of each authorized designee shall be printed on the temporary instruction permit, however, the director may delay the time at which permits are printed bearing such names until the inventories of blank permits and related forms existing on August 28, 1998, are exhausted.
- 74 The director, upon proper application on a form prescribed by the director, in his or her discretion, may 75 76 issue a restricted instruction permit effective for a school 77 year or more restricted period to an applicant who is enrolled in a high school driver training program taught by 78 a driver training instructor holding a valid driver 79 80 education endorsement on a teaching certificate issued by the state department of elementary and secondary education 81 even though the applicant has not reached the age of sixteen 82

83 years but has passed the age of fifteen years. Such

84 instruction permit shall entitle the applicant, when the

- 85 applicant has such permit in his or her immediate
- 86 possession, to operate a motor vehicle on the highways, but
- 87 only when a driver training instructor holding a valid
- 88 driver education endorsement on a teaching certificate
- 89 issued by the state department of elementary and secondary
- 90 education is occupying a seat beside the driver.
- 91 4. The director, in his or her discretion, may issue a
- 92 temporary driver's permit to an applicant who is otherwise
- 93 qualified for a license permitting the applicant to operate
- 94 a motor vehicle while the director is completing the
- 95 director's investigation and determination of all facts
- 96 relative to such applicant's rights to receive a license.
- 97 Such permit must be in the applicant's immediate possession
- 98 while operating a motor vehicle, and it shall be invalid
- 99 when the applicant's license has been issued or for good
- 100 cause has been refused.
- 101 5. In the event that the applicant for a temporary
- instruction permit described in subsection 1 of this section
- 103 is a participant in a federal residential job training
- 104 program, the permittee may operate a motor vehicle
- 105 accompanied by a driver training instructor who holds a
- 106 valid driver education endorsement issued by the department
- 107 of elementary and secondary education and a valid driver's
- 108 license.
- 109 6. A person at least fifteen years of age may operate
- 110 a motor vehicle as part of a driver training program taught
- 111 by a driver training instructor holding a valid driver
- 112 education endorsement on a teaching certificate issued by
- 113 the department of elementary and secondary education or a
- 114 qualified instructor of a private drivers' education program.

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- Beginning January 1, 2003, the director shall issue 115 116 with every temporary instruction permit issued pursuant to 117 subsection 1 of this section a sticker or sign bearing the words "PERMIT DRIVER". The design and size of such sticker 118 119 or sign shall be determined by the director by regulation. 120 Every applicant issued a temporary instruction permit and sticker on or after January 1, 2003, may display or affix 121 122 the sticker or sign on the rear window of the motor 123 vehicle. Such sticker or sign may be displayed on the rear 124 window of the motor vehicle whenever the holder of the

Beginning July 1, 2005, the director shall verify that an applicant for an instruction permit issued under 128 129 this section is lawfully present in the United States before 130 accepting the application. The director shall not issue an 131 instruction permit for a period that exceeds an applicant's lawful presence in the United States. The director may 132 133 establish procedures to verify the lawful presence of the applicant and establish the duration of any permit issued 134 under this section. 135

- 9. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no moving violation shall be reduced or amended to a nonmoving violation for any person holding a temporary instruction permit issued under the provisions of this section.
- 141 10. The director may adopt rules and regulations 142 necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

302.178. 1. Any person between the ages of sixteen

- 2 and eighteen years who is qualified to obtain a license
- 3 pursuant to sections 302.010 to 302.340 may apply for, and
- 4 the director shall issue, an intermediate driver's license

5 entitling the applicant, while having such license in his or

- 6 her possession, to operate a motor vehicle of the
- 7 appropriate class upon the highways of this state in
- 8 conjunction with the requirements of this section. An
- 9 intermediate driver's license shall be readily
- 10 distinguishable from a license issued to those over the age
- 11 of eighteen. All applicants for an intermediate driver's
- 12 license shall:
- 13 (1) Successfully complete the examination required by
- 14 section 302.173;
- 15 (2) Pay the fee required by subsection 4 of this
- 16 section;
- 17 (3) Have had a temporary instruction permit issued
- 18 pursuant to subsection 1 of section 302.130 for at least a
- 19 six-month period or a valid license from another state; and
- 20 (4) Have a parent, grandparent, legal guardian, or, if
- 21 the applicant is a participant in a federal residential job
- 22 training program, a driving instructor employed by a federal
- 23 residential job training program, sign the application
- 24 stating that the applicant has completed at least forty
- 25 hours of supervised driving experience under a temporary
- 26 instruction permit issued pursuant to subsection 1 of
- 27 section 302.130, or, if the applicant is an emancipated
- 28 minor, the person over twenty-one years of age who
- 29 supervised such driving. For purposes of this section, the
- 30 term "emancipated minor" means a person who is at least
- 31 sixteen years of age, but less than eighteen years of age,
- 32 who:
- 33 (a) Marries with the consent of the legal custodial
- 34 parent or legal guardian pursuant to section 451.080;
- 35 (b) Has been declared emancipated by a court of
- 36 competent jurisdiction;

- 37 (c) Enters active duty in the Armed Forces;
- 38 (d) Has written consent to the emancipation from the
- 39 custodial parent or legal guardian; or
- 40 (e) Through employment or other means provides for
- 41 such person's own food, shelter and other cost-of-living
- 42 expenses;
- 43 (5) Have had no alcohol-related enforcement contacts
- 44 as defined in section 302.525 during the preceding twelve
- 45 months; and
- 46 (6) Have no nonalcoholic traffic convictions for which
- 47 points are assessed pursuant to section 302.302, within the
- 48 preceding six months.
- 49 2. An intermediate driver's license grants the
- 50 licensee the same privileges to operate that classification
- of motor vehicle as a license issued pursuant to section
- 52 302.177, except that no person shall operate a motor vehicle
- 53 on the highways of this state under such an intermediate
- 54 driver's license between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00
- 55 a.m. unless accompanied by a person described in subsection
- 1 of section 302.130; except the licensee may operate a
- 57 motor vehicle without being accompanied if the travel is to
- 58 or from a school or educational program or activity, a
- 59 regular place of employment or in emergency situations as
- 60 defined by the director by regulation.
- 3. Each intermediate driver's license shall be
- 62 restricted by requiring that the driver and all passengers
- in the licensee's vehicle wear safety belts at all times.
- 64 This safety belt restriction shall not apply to a person
- 65 operating a motorcycle. For the first six months after
- 66 issuance of the intermediate driver's license, the holder of
- 67 the license shall not operate a motor vehicle with more than
- one passenger who is under the age of nineteen who is not a

- 69 member of the holder's immediate family. As used in this
- 70 subsection, an intermediate driver's license holder's
- 71 immediate family shall include brothers, sisters,
- 72 stepbrothers or stepsisters of the driver, including adopted
- 73 or foster children residing in the same household of the
- 74 intermediate driver's license holder. After the expiration
- 75 of the first six months, the holder of an intermediate
- 76 driver's license shall not operate a motor vehicle with more
- 77 than three passengers who are under nineteen years of age
- 78 and who are not members of the holder's immediate family.
- 79 The passenger restrictions of this subsection shall not be
- 80 applicable to any intermediate driver's license holder who
- 81 is operating a motor vehicle being used in agricultural work-
- 82 related activities.
- 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 302.177
- 84 to the contrary, the fee for an intermediate driver's
- 85 license shall be five dollars and such license shall be
- 86 valid for a period of two years.
- 87 5. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
- 88 contrary, no moving violation shall be reduced or amended to
- 89 a nonmoving violation for any person holding an intermediate
- 90 driver's license issued under the provisions of this
- 91 section.
- 92 6. Any intermediate driver's licensee accumulating six
- 93 or more points in a twelve-month period may be required to
- 94 participate in and successfully complete a driver-
- 95 improvement program approved by the state highways and
- 96 transportation commission. The driver-improvement program
- 97 ordered by the director of revenue shall not be used in lieu
- 98 of point assessment.
- 99 [6.] 7. (1) An intermediate driver's licensee who
- 100 has, for the preceding twelve-month period, had no alcohol-

101 related enforcement contacts, as defined in section 302.525

- 102 and no traffic convictions for which points are assessed,
- 103 upon reaching the age of eighteen years or within the thirty
- 104 days immediately preceding their eighteenth birthday may
- 105 apply for and receive without further examination, other
- 106 than a vision test as prescribed by section 302.173, a
- 107 license issued pursuant to this chapter granting full
- 108 driving privileges. Such person shall pay the required fee
- 109 for such license as prescribed in section 302.177.
- 110 (2) If an intermediate driver's license expires on a
- 111 Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, such license shall
- 112 remain valid for the five business days immediately
- 113 following the expiration date. In no case shall a licensee
- 114 whose intermediate driver's license expires on a Saturday,
- 115 Sunday, or legal holiday be guilty of an offense of driving
- 116 with an expired or invalid driver's license if such offense
- 117 occurred within five business days immediately following an
- 118 expiration date that occurs on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal
- 119 holiday.
- 120 (3) The director of revenue shall deny an application
- 121 for a full driver's license until the person has had no
- 122 traffic convictions for which points are assessed for a
- 123 period of twelve months prior to the date of application for
- 124 license or until the person is eligible to apply for a six-
- year driver's license as provided for in section 302.177,
- 126 provided the applicant is otherwise eligible for full
- 127 driving privileges. An intermediate driver's license shall
- 128 expire when the licensee is eligible and receives a full
- 129 driver's license as prescribed in subdivision (1) of this
- 130 section.
- [7.] 8. No person upon reaching the age of eighteen
- 132 years whose intermediate driver's license and driving

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privilege is denied, suspended, cancelled or revoked in this 133 134 state or any other state for any reason may apply for a full 135 driver's license until such license or driving privilege is fully reinstated. Any such person whose intermediate 136 137 driver's license has been revoked pursuant to the provisions 138 of sections 302.010 to 302.540 shall, upon receipt of reinstatement of the revocation from the director, pass the 139 140 complete driver examination, apply for a new license, and 141 pay the proper fee before again operating a motor vehicle 142 upon the highways of this state.

- [8.] 9. A person shall be exempt from the intermediate licensing requirements if the person has reached the age of eighteen years and meets all other licensing requirements.
- 146 [9.] 10. Any person who violates any of the provisions
 147 of this section relating to intermediate drivers' licenses
 148 or the provisions of section 302.130 relating to temporary
 149 instruction permits is guilty of an infraction, and no
 150 points shall be assessed to his or her driving record for
 151 any such violation.
- 152 [10.] 11. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the 153 authority delegated in this section shall become effective 154 only if it complies with and is subject to all of the 155 156 provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 157 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and 158 if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective 159 date or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held 160 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and 161 any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2000, shall be 162 invalid and void. 163
