AN ACT

To repeal sections 337.035, 337.330, 337.525, 337.630, and 337.730, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof five new sections relating to conversion therapy for minors, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 337.035, 337.330, 337.525, 337.630,
and 337.730, RSMo, are repealed and five new sections enacted
in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 337.035, 337.330,
337.525, 337.630, and 337.730, to read as follows:

337.035. 1. The committee may refuse to issue any certificate of registration or authority, permit or license 2 3 required pursuant to this chapter for one or any combination of causes stated in subsection 2 of this section. 4 The committee shall notify the applicant in writing of the 5 reasons for the refusal and shall advise the applicant of 6 7 the applicant's right to file a complaint with the administrative hearing commission as provided by chapter 621. 8

9 The committee may cause a complaint to be filed 2. 10 with the administrative hearing commission as provided by 11 chapter 621 against any holder of any certificate of registration or authority, permit or license required by 12 this chapter or any person who has failed to renew or has 13 surrendered the person's certificate of registration or 14 authority, permit or license for any one or any combination 15 of the following causes: 16

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17 (1) Use of any controlled substance, as defined in 18 chapter 195, or alcoholic beverage to an extent that such 19 use impairs a person's ability to perform the work of any 20 profession licensed or regulated by this chapter;

(2) The person has been finally adjudicated and found guilty, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, in a criminal prosecution under the laws of any state, of the United States, or of any country, for any offense directly related to the duties and responsibilities of the occupation, as set forth in section 324.012, regardless of whether or not sentence is imposed;

(3) Use of fraud, deception, misrepresentation or
bribery in securing any certificate of registration or
authority, permit or license issued pursuant to this chapter
or in obtaining permission to take any examination given or
required pursuant to this chapter;

33 (4) Obtaining or attempting to obtain any fee, charge,
34 tuition or other compensation by fraud, deception or
35 misrepresentation;

36 (5) Incompetency, misconduct, gross negligence, fraud, 37 misrepresentation or dishonesty in the performance of the 38 functions or duties of any profession licensed or regulated 39 by this chapter;

For 101 purposes of this section, an interested third party includes a parent or quardian of a person who received treatment by a 102 psychologist or any person who is related within the second 103 104 degree of consanguinity or affinity and who is financially 105 responsible for the payment of such treatment.

337.330. 1. The committee may refuse to issue any license required under this chapter for one or any combination of causes stated in subsection 2 of this section. The committee shall notify the applicant in writing of the reasons for the refusal and shall advise the applicant of the applicant's right to file a complaint with

7 the administrative hearing commission as provided by chapter 8 621.
