ANACT

To repeal sections 227.299, 227.450, 301.020, and 302.171, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof thirty-one new sections relating to military affairs, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 227.299, 227.450, 301.020, and

- 2 302.171, RSMo, are repealed and thirty-one new sections enacted
- 3 in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 41.201, 41.676,
- 4 143.1032, 227.299, 227.450, 227.463, 227.464, 227.465, 227.466,
- 5 227.467, 227.477, 227.478, 227.486, 227.488, 227.489, 227.490,
- 6 227.495, 227.496, 227.497, 227.498, 227.777, 227.780, 227.781,
- 7 227.782, 227.783, 227.784, 227.785, 227.793, 301.020, 302.171,
- 8 and 1, to read as follows:
 - 41.201. Service members of the Missouri National Guard
- 2 shall be considered state employees for the purposes of
- 3 operating state-owned vehicles for official state business
- 4 unless the members are called into active federal military
- 5 service by order of the President of the United States
- 6 pursuant to Title 10 of the United States Code.
 - 41.676. The National Guard armory located in or
- 2 nearest to Joplin shall be designated as the "Sergeant
- 3 Robert Wayne Crow Jr. Memorial Armory".
 - 143.1032. 1. In each taxable year beginning on or
- 2 after January 1, 2022, each individual or corporation

- 3 entitled to a tax refund in an amount sufficient to make a
- 4 designation under this section may designate that one dollar
- or any amount in excess of one dollar on a single return,

- 7 combined return, of the refund due be credited to the
- 8 Missouri Medal of Honor fund. The contribution designation
- 9 authorized by this section shall be clearly and
- 10 unambiguously printed on the first page of each income tax

- 27 administered by the director of revenue.
- 28 3. The director of revenue shall deposit at least
- 29 monthly all contributions designated by the corporations
- 30 under this section, less an amount sufficient to cover the
- 31 cost of collection, handling, and administration by the
- 32 department of revenue during fiscal year 2021, to the
- 33 Missouri Medal of Honor fund.

- 4. A contribution designated under this section shall only be deposited in the Missouri Medal of Honor fund after all other claims against the refund from which such contribution is to be made have been satisfied.
- 5. Moneys deposited in the Missouri Medal of Honor fund shall be used by the department of transportation to pay for the costs of the Missouri Medal of Honor signs.
- 6. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund.
- 227.299. 1. Except as provided in subsection 7 of
 this section, an organization or person that seeks a bridge
 or highway designation on the state highway system to honor
 an event, place, organization, or person who has been
 deceased for more than two years shall petition the
 department of transportation by submitting the following:
- (1) An application in a form prescribed by the 7 8 director, describing the bridge or segment of highway for which designation is sought and the proposed name of the 9 bridge or relevant portion of highway. The application 10 shall include the name of at least one current member of the 11 general assembly who will sponsor the bridge or highway 12 designation. The application may contain written testimony 13 for support of the bridge or highway designation; 14
- (2) A list of at least one hundred signatures of individuals who support the naming of the bridge or highway; and
- 18 (3) A fee to be determined by the commission to cover 19 the costs of constructing and maintaining the proposed 20 signs. The fee shall not exceed the cost of constructing 21 and maintaining each sign.

- 2. All moneys received by the department of
 transportation for the construction and maintenance of
 bridge or highway signs on the state highway system shall be
- deposited in the state treasury to the credit of the state
- 26 road fund.
- 27 3. The documents and fees required under this section
- 28 shall be submitted to the department of transportation no
- 29 later than November first prior to the next regular session
- 30 of the general assembly to be approved or denied by the
- 31 joint committee on transportation oversight during such
- 32 legislative session.
- 4. The department of transportation shall give notice
- 34 of any proposed bridge or highway designation on the state
- 35 highway system in a manner reasonably calculated to advise
- 36 the public of such proposal. Reasonable notice shall
- 37 include posting the proposal for the designation on the
- 38 department's official public website, and making available
- 39 copies of the sign designation application to any
- 40 representative of the news media or public upon request and
- 41 posting the application on a bulletin board or other
- 42 prominent public place which is easily accessible to the
- 43 public and clearly designated for that purpose at the
- 44 principal office.
- 45 5. If the memorial highway designation requested by
- 46 the organization is not approved by the joint committee on
- 47 transportation oversight, ninety-seven percent of the
- 48 application fee shall be refunded to the requesting
- 49 organization.
- 50 6. Two highway signs shall be erected for each bridge
- 51 and highway designation on the state highway system
- 52 processed under this section. When a named section of a
- 53 highway crosses two or more county lines, consideration

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- shall be given by the department of transportation to allow additional signage at the county lines or major intersections.
- 7. (1) Highway or bridge designations on the state
 highway system honoring fallen law enforcement officers,
 members of the Armed Forces killed in the line of duty,

 Missouri recipients of the Medal of Honor, emergency
 personnel killed while performing duties relating to their
 employment, or state employees killed while serving the
 state shall not be subject to the provisions of this section.
 - (2) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, beginning August 28, 2021, for designations honoring Missouri Medal of Honor recipients, no fees shall be assessed and all costs associated with such designations shall be funded by the department of transportation.
 - 8. No bridge or portion of a highway on the state highway system may be named or designated after more than one event, place, organization, or person. Each event, place, organization, or person shall only be eligible for one bridge or highway designation.
- 74 9. Any highway signs erected for any bridge or highway designation on the state highway system under the provisions 75 76 of this section shall be erected and maintained for a twenty-77 year period. After such period, the signs shall be subject 78 to removal by the department of transportation and the 79 bridge or highway may be designated to honor events, places, 80 organizations, or persons other than the current designee. An existing highway or bridge designation processed under 81 the provisions of this section may be retained for 82 additional twenty-year increments if, at least one year 83 before the designation's expiration, an application to the 84

- 7 the costs to be paid for by private donations.
 - 227.463. The portion of Interstate 29 from its
- 2 intersection of Interstate 70/U.S. State Highway 71/40 in
- 3 Jackson County north to the bridge crossing over Nishnabotna
- 4 River in Atchison County, except for those portions of
- 5 Interstate 29 previously designated as of August 28, 2021,
- 6 shall be designated the "Purple Heart Trail". Costs for
- 7 such designation shall be paid by private donations.
 - 227.464. The portion of Interstate 55 from State
- 2 Highway O in Pemiscot County to U.S. Highway 40 in St. Louis
- 3 City, except for those portions of Interstate 55 previously
- 4 designated as of August 28, 2021, shall be designated the
- 5 "Purple Heart Trail". Costs for such designation shall be
- 6 paid by private donations.
 - 227.465. The portion of Interstate 57 from the
- 2 Missouri/Illinois state line in Mississippi County
- 3 continuing south to U.S. State Highway 60/State Highway AA
- 4 in Scott County shall be designated the "Purple Heart

5 Trail". Costs for such designation shall be paid by private

- 6 donations.
- 227.466. The portion of Interstate 64 from Interstate
- 2 70 from the city of Wentzville in St. Charles County
- 3 continuing east to Interstate 55 at the Missouri/Illinois
- 4 state line in St. Louis City, except for those portions of
- 5 Interstate 64/US40/US61 previously designated as of August
- 6 28, 2021, shall be designated the "Purple Heart Trail".
- 7 Costs for such designation shall be paid by private
- 8 donations.
 - 227.467. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter
- 2 to the contrary, a highway's classification as a "Purple
- 3 Heart Trail" shall not prevent a segment of such highway
- 4 from being additionally designated as a memorial highway.
- 227.477. The portion of U.S. Business 71 from State
- 2 Highway 76 West to State Highway EE in McDonald County shall

- 2 Mockingbird Road continuing east to State Highway PP in
- 3 Webster County shall be designated as the "Army SGT Timothy
- 4 J Sutton Memorial Highway". The department of
- 5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs

6 designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by

- 7 private donations.
- 227.488. The bridge on U.S. State Highway 63 crossing
- 2 over Business 63 in Adair County shall be designated the
- 3 "U.S. Army SGT Brandon Maggart Memorial Bridge". The
- 4 department of transportation shall erect and maintain
- 5 appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the costs to
- 6 be paid for by private donations.
 - 227.489. The bridge on U.S. Highway 63 crossing over
- the BSNF Railroad/Marceline Sub in La Plata in Macon County
- 3 shall be designated as the "U.S. Army PFC Adam L Thomas
- 4 Memorial Bridge". The department of transportation shall
- 5 erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such
- 6 bridge, with the costs to be paid for by private donations.
- 227.490. The bridge on U.S. State Highway 63 crossing
- over Patterson Street in Adair County shall be designated as
- 3 the "U.S. Army SFC Matthew C Lewellen Memorial Bridge". The
- 4 department of transportation shall erect and maintain
- 5 appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the costs to
- 6 be paid for by private donations.
 - 227.495. The portion of U.S. State Highway 54 from
- 2 State Highway E to State Highway D in Cole County shall be
- 3 designated as the "U.S. Army Specialist Michael Campbell
- 4 Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall
- 5 erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such
- 6 highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.
- 227.496. The portion of State Highway T from .05 miles
- 2 west of Laretto Ridge Drive to Decker Road in the town of
- 3 Labadie in Franklin County shall be designated as "Medal of
- 4 Honor PVT George Phillips Memorial Highway". The department
- 5 of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs

6 designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by the

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7 department.

227.497. The portion of U.S. State Highway 63 from

- 2 Spruce Street to McKay Street within the city of Macon in
- 3 Macon County shall be designated as the "US Army Sergeant
- 4 Hugh C Dunn Memorial Highway". The department of
- 5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs
- 6 designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by
- 7 private donations.
 - 227.498. The portion of Interstate 64 from Winghaven
- 2 Boulevard to Prospect Road within the city of Lake St. Louis
- 3 in St. Charles County shall be designated as "US Navy SEAL
- 4 Scotty Wirtz Memorial Highway". The department of
- 5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs
- 6 designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by

 - 227.777. The bridge on State Highway 17 crossing over

- 3 County shall be designated as "US Navy FA Paul Akers Jr
- 4 Memorial Bridge". The department of transportation shall
- 5 erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such
- 6 bridge, with the costs to be paid by private donations.
 - 227.780. The portion of State Highway 163 from Stadium

- 3 Drive in Boone County shall be designated as "PFC Dale
- 4 Raymond Jackson Memorial Highway". The department of
- 5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs

- 3 "Veterans Memorial Bridge". The department of
- 4 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs
- 5 designating such bridge, with the costs to be paid by
- 6 private donations.
 - 227.793. The portion of Interstate 44 from State
- 2 Highway 744/N. MulRoy Road continuing east to RA IS 44
- 3 Strafford/Greene County Line in Greene County shall be
- 4 designated the "Nathanael Greene Highway". The department of
- 5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs

designating such highway, with the cost to be paid for by private donations.

301.020. 1. Every owner of a motor vehicle or

- 2 trailer, which shall be operated or driven upon the highways
- 3 of this state, except as herein otherwise expressly
- 4 provided, shall annually file, by mail or otherwise, in the
- 5 office of the director of revenue, an application for
- 6 registration on a blank to be furnished by the director of
- 7 revenue for that purpose containing:
- 8 (1) A brief description of the motor vehicle or
- 9 trailer to be registered, including the name of the
- 10 manufacturer, the vehicle identification number, the amount

If the vehicle requires the issuance of a special number by the director of revenue or a replacement vehicle 76 77 identification number, the applicant shall submit the 78 required application and application fee. All applications 79 required under this subsection shall be submitted with any applicable taxes which may be due on the purchase of the 80 81 vehicle or parts. The director of revenue shall appropriately designate "Reconstructed Motor Vehicle", 82 "Motor Change Vehicle", "Non-USA-Std Motor Vehicle", or 83 "Specially Constructed Motor Vehicle" on the current and all 84 subsequent issues of the certificate of ownership of such 85 86 vehicle.

- 48 information on penalties imposed by law for violation of the

- January 1, 2001, if the applicant is less than eighteen
- 51 years of age, the applicant must comply with all

A symbol may be placed on 87 the front of the license or identification card indicating 88 the applicant's desire to be listed in the registry at the 89 90 applicant's request at the time of his or her application 91 for a driver's license or identification card, or the 92 applicant may instead request an organ donor sticker from the department of health and senior services by application 93 on the department of health and senior services' website. 94 95 Upon receipt of an organ donor sticker sent by the department of health and senior services, the applicant 96 97 shall place the sticker on the back of his or her driver's license or identification card to indicate that he or she 98

The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may be refused by the applicant 118 for the license at the time of issuance or renewal of the 119 120 license. The director shall inquire of each applicant at the time the licensee presents the completed application to 121 122 the director whether the applicant is interested in making 123 the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.
 - 4. An applicant for registration may make a donation of one dollar to the Missouri Medal of Honor recipients fund. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit all such donations in the state treasury to the credit of the Missouri Medal of Honor recipients fund as established in Section 1 of this Act. Moneys in the Medal of Honor recipients fund shall be used solely for the

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purposes established in Section 1 of this Act, except that 131 132 the department of revenue shall retain no more than one 133 percent for its administrative costs. The donation 134 prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may be refused by the applicant for registration at the time of 135 136 issuance or renewal. The director shall inquire of each applicant at the time the applicant presents the completed 137 138 application to the director whether the applicant is 139 interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.

Beginning July 1, 2005, the director shall deny the driving privilege of any person who commits fraud or deception during the examination process or who makes application for an instruction permit, driver's license, or nondriver's license which contains or is substantiated with false or fraudulent information or documentation, or who knowingly conceals a material fact or otherwise commits a fraud in any such application. The period of denial shall be one year from the effective date of the denial notice sent by the director. The denial shall become effective ten days after the date the denial notice is mailed to the The notice shall be mailed to the person at the last known address shown on the person's driving record. The notice shall be deemed received three days after mailing unless returned by the postal authorities. No such individual shall reapply for a driver's examination, instruction permit, driver's license, or nondriver's license until the period of denial is completed. No individual who is denied the driving privilege under this section shall be eligible for a limited driving privilege issued under section 302.309.

- [5.] **6.** All appeals of denials under this section shall be made as required by section 302.311.
- 164 [6.] 7. The period of limitation for criminal 165 prosecution under this section shall be extended under 166 subdivision (1) of subsection 3 of section 556.036.
