## AN ACT

To amend chapter 115, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to qualifications for certification of presidential and vice presidential candidates by the secretary of state.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 115, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 115.757, to read as follows:

115.757. 1. The secretary of state shall not certify any candidate for president or vice-president unless that candidate has provided the  $\mathbf{2}$ 3 secretary of state with proof that the requirements of 8 U.S.C. 1401, 8 U.S.C. 1402, 8 U.S.C. 1406, and 8 U.S.C. 1407 are satisfied. For proof of 4 5 live birth, a certification of live birth that does not record the name of the birthing facility or street address of the location where the birth 6 occurred, or does not display the signature of the certifying 7 8 administrator, designated representative of the birthing facility, physician, midwife, or other legally authorized person in attendance at 9 birth will not be accepted by the secretary of state for consideration as 10 proof. A long form birth certificate that does record the name of the 11 birthing facility or street address of the location where the birth 12occurred and does display the signature of the certifying administrator, 1314designated representative of the birthing facility, physician, midwife, or other legally authorized person in attendance at birth will be 15required as proof if one exists. 16

2. The secretary of state shall make the proof of birth required
pursuant to subsection 1 of this section, including a long-form birth
certificate, if one is provided, available for public viewing via the
internet.
