## AN ACT

To repeal section 442.606, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to remedies for failing to disclose that a parcel of real estate was a site for methamphetamine production, with a penalty provision.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 442.606, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 442.606, to read as follows:

442.606. 1. In the event that any parcel of real property to be sold,

- 2 exchanged or transferred is or was used as a site for methamphetamine
- 3 production, the seller or transferor shall disclose in writing to the buyer or
- 4 transferee the fact that methamphetamine was produced on the premises,
- 5 provided that the seller or transferor had knowledge of such prior
- 6 methamphetamine production. The seller or transferor shall disclose any prior
- 7 knowledge of methamphetamine production, regardless of whether the persons
- 8 involved in the production were convicted for such production.
- 9 2. A seller or transferor of any parcel of real property shall disclose in
- 10 writing the fact that any premises to be sold or transferred either was the place
- 11 of residence of a person convicted of any of the following crimes, or was the
- 12 storage site or laboratory for any of the substances for which a person was
- 13 convicted of any of the following crimes, provided that the seller or transferor
- 14 knew or should have known of such convictions:
- 15 (1) Creation of a controlled substance in violation of section 579.110;
- 16 (2) Possession of ephedrine with intent to manufacture methamphetamine
- 17 [in violation of section 195.246];
- 18 (3) Unlawful use of drug paraphernalia with the intent to manufacture

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

- 19 methamphetamine in violation of subsection 2 of section 579.074;
- 20 (4) Endangering the welfare of a child by any of the means described in subdivision (4) [or (5)] of subsection 1 of section 568.045; or 21
- 22 (5) Any other crime related to methamphetamine, its salts, optical isomers and salts of its optical isomers either in chapter 195, or in any other provision of 23 24law.
- 25 3. (1) Any seller or transferor who knowingly violates the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor. 26
- (2) Any buyer or transferee who suffers any injury as a result of a seller or transferor knowingly violating the provisions of this section 29may recover in a civil action compensatory damages, including damages for any medical expenses incurred as a result of exposure to 31 methamphetamine.
