## **AN ACT**

To repeal sections 493.025, 493.027, 493.050, and 493.055, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof four new sections relating to publication of notice.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 493.025, 493.027, 493.050, and

- 2 493.055, RSMo, are repealed and four new sections enacted in
- 3 lieu thereof, to be known as sections 493.025, 493.027, 493.050,
- 4 and 493.055, to read as follows:

493.025. Except where otherwise provided in this

- 2 chapter, [when the publication of a law, proclamation,
- 3 nominations to office, proposed constitutional amendments or
- 4 other questions to be submitted to the people, order or
- 5 notice shall be published in any newspaper for the state, or
- 6 for any public officer on account of, or in the name of the
- 7 state, or for any county, or for any public officer on
- 8 account of, or in the name of any county, or any legal
- 9 advertisement, legal notice, order of court or public notice
- 10 of any kind is allowed or required by law, a] for all public
- 11 advertisements, notices, orders of publication, and legal
- 12 publications required by law or directed by the court to be
- 13 published in a newspaper, newspaper of general circulation,
- 14 or daily newspaper, including but not limited to notices
- 15 pertaining to any amendments to the Missouri Constitution
- 16 and to the revised statutes of the state of Missouri, legal
- 17 publications affecting all sales of real estate under a

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18 power of sale contained in any mortgage or deed of trust, including notices required by sections 443.310 and 443.320, 19 20 the newspaper publishing the notice shall also place the 21 notice on a website established and maintained by at least a majority of the newspapers whose principal place of business 22 23 is in Missouri, at no additional cost to the state, to any political subdivision or to any person or entity thereof who 24 25 shall be responsible for directing the notice be published. 26 The newspaper publishing such notice shall charge and 27 receive not more than its regular local classified advertising rate. The regular local classified advertising 28 rate is that rate shown by the newspaper's rate schedule as 29 offered to the public, including any volume discounts or 30 repeat discounts, and shall have been in effect for at least 31 thirty days preceding publication of the particular notice 32 33 to which it is applied. When any such notice is required to 34 be published more than once, the newspaper may not charge for the second and successive insertions of the notice at a 35 36 rate greater than eighty-five percent of the newspaper's 37 regular local classified advertising rate.

493.027. In any first classification county, or in any 2 city not within a county, a board consisting of the judges 3 of the circuit court of such county, or a majority of them, 4 if they deem it in the public interest, may qualify any 5 newspaper of general circulation, and as further qualified 6 in section 493.050, for the publication of public notices 7 and advertisements, and may review and approve rates which may be charged for public notices and advertisements. 8 9 rates may not exceed those rates and any discounts allowed 10 pursuant to section 493.025.

493.050. All public advertisements and orders of publication required by law to be made and all legal

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publications affecting the title to real estate, and all 3 4 such public notices as described in section 493.025, shall 5 be published in some daily, triweekly, semiweekly or weekly newspaper of general circulation in the county where located 6 7 and which shall have been admitted to the post office as periodicals class matter in the city of publication; shall 8 9 have been published regularly and consecutively for a period 10 of three years, except that a newspaper of general circulation may be deemed to be the successor to a defunct 11 12 newspaper of general circulation, and subject to all of the rights and privileges of said prior newspaper under this 13 statute, if the successor newspaper shall begin publication 14 15 no later than thirty consecutive days after the termination of publication of the prior newspaper; shall have a list of 16 bona fide subscribers voluntarily engaged as such, who have 17 paid or agreed to pay a stated price for a subscription for 18 a definite period of time; provided, that when a public 19 20 notice, required by law to be published once a week for a 21 given number of weeks, shall be published in a daily, triweekly, semiweekly or weekly newspaper, the notice shall 22 appear once a week, on the same day of each week, and 23 further provided, that every affidavit to proof of 24 publication shall state that the newspaper in which such 25 26 notice was published has complied with the provisions of this section; provided further, that the duration of 27 28 consecutive publication provided for in this section shall 29 not affect newspapers which have become legal publications prior to September 6, 1937; provided, however, that when any 30 31 newspaper shall be forced to suspend publication in any time of war, due to the owner or publisher being inducted into 32 the Armed Forces of the United States, the newspaper may be 33 reinstated within one year after actual hostilities have 34

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35 ceased, with all the benefits provided pursuant to the provisions of this section, upon the filing with the 36 37 secretary of state of notice of intention of such owner or publisher, the owner's surviving spouse or legal heirs, to 38 republish such newspaper, setting forth the name of the 39 40 publication, its volume and number, its frequency of 41 publication, and its readmission to the post office where it 42 was previously entered as periodicals class mail matter, and when it shall have a list of bona fide subscribers 43 44 voluntarily engaged as such who have paid or agreed to pay a stated price for subscription for a definite period of 45 The newspaper publishing the notice shall also, at no 46 time. additional cost to the state, to any political subdivision, 47 48 or to any person or entity thereof responsible for the 49 ordering of the publication, place the notice on a website 50 established and maintained by at least a majority of the 51 newspapers whose principal place of business is in 52 Missouri. The newspaper publishing such notice shall charge and receive not more than its regular local classified 53 advertising rate as defined in section 493.025. The regular 54 local classified advertising rate is that rate shown by the 55 newspaper's rate schedule, including any volume discounts or 56 57 repeat discounts, as offered to the public, and shall have 58 been in effect for at least thirty days preceding 59 publication of the particular notice to which it is 60 When any such notice is required to be published 61 more than once, the newspaper may not charge for the second and successive insertions of the notice at a rate greater 62 than eighty-five percent of the newspaper's regular local 63 64 classified advertising rate. All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this section except sections 493.070 to 65 493.120, are hereby repealed. 66

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493.055. All public advertisements and orders of 2 publication required by law to be made, including but not limited to amendments to the Missouri Constitution and to 3 the revised statutes of the state of Missouri, legal 4 publications affecting all sales of real estate under a 5 6 power of sale contained in any mortgage or deed of trust, and other legal publications affecting the title to real 7 8 estate, shall be published in a newspaper of general 9 circulation, qualified under the provisions of section 493.050, and all such public notices shall be posted on a 10 website as required in sections 493.025 and 493.050 and 11 charged at the rate including any discounts as described in 12 sections 493.025 and 493.050 and persons responsible for 13 orders of publication described in sections 443.310 and 14 443.320 shall be subject to the prohibitions in sections 15 16 493.130 and 493.140.

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
