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**AN ACT**

To amend chapter 170, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to youth suicide awareness and prevention education.

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*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Chapter 170, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto two new sections, to be known as sections 170.047 and 170.048, to read as follows:

**170.047. 1. Beginning in the 2016-2017 school year, any licensed educator may annually complete up to two hours of training or professional development in youth suicide awareness and prevention as part of the professional development hours required for state board of education certification.**

**2. The department of elementary and secondary education shall develop guidelines suitable for training or professional development in youth suicide awareness and prevention. The department shall develop materials that may be used for such training or professional development.**

**3. For purposes of this section, the term "licensed educator" shall refer to any teacher with a certificate of license to teach issued by the state board of education or any other educator or administrator required to maintain a professional license issued by the state board of education.**

**4. The department of elementary and secondary education may promulgate rules and regulations to implement this section.**

**5. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of**

21 the provisions of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This  
22 section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers  
23 vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, to review, to  
24 delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are  
25 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking  
26 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2015, shall  
27 be invalid and void.

170.048. 1. By July 1, 2017, each district shall adopt a policy for  
2 youth suicide awareness and prevention, including the training and  
3 education of district employees.

4 2. Each district's policy shall address, but need not be limited to  
5 the following:

6 (1) Strategies that can help identify students who are at possible  
7 risk of suicide;

8 (2) Strategies and protocols for helping students at possible risk  
9 of suicide; and

10 (3) Protocols for responding to a suicide death.

11 3. By July 1, 2016, the department of elementary and secondary  
12 education shall develop a model policy that districts may adopt. When  
13 developing the model policy, the department shall cooperate, consult  
14 with, and seek input from organizations that have expertise in youth  
15 suicide awareness and prevention. By July 1, 2020, and at least every  
16 three years thereafter, the department shall request information and  
17 seek feedback from districts on their experience with the policy for  
18 youth suicide awareness and prevention. The department shall review  
19 this information and may use it to adapt the department's model  
20 policy. The department shall post any information on its website that  
21 it has received from districts that it deems relevant. The department  
22 shall not post any confidential information or any information that  
23 personally identifies any student or school employee.

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
