AN ACT

To amend chapter 311, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to retail storage and transport of alcohol.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 311, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new
2 section, to be known as section 311.367, to read as follows:

**311.367. 1. The provisions of this section shall apply to all
2 persons, firms, or corporations who own and operate more than one
3 premises licensed to sell intoxicating liquor containing alcohol in
4 excess of five percent by weight at retail.**

5 **2. Any person, firm, or corporation described in subsection 1 of
6 this section, with the permission of the supervisor of alcohol and
7 tobacco control, may designate one or more places in this state as a
8 central warehouse to which intoxicating liquors ordered and purchased
9 by a person, firm, or corporation from licensed wholesalers in this state
10 may be delivered by licensed wholesalers in this state and at which
11 intoxicating liquors so owned by a person, firm, or corporation may be
12 stored.**

13 **3. Any person, firm, or corporation described in subsection 1 of
14 this section who owns and stores intoxicating liquors in a central
15 warehouse may transport or transfer all or any part of the intoxicating
16 liquors so stored from the central warehouse in this state to any
17 premises licensed to sell intoxicating liquors at retail which is owned
18 and operated by the same person, firm, or corporation and which is
19 located in the state; provided, however, beer and other intoxicating
20 malt liquor are not transferred from the central warehouses to other**

21 retail licensed premises due to the perishability and limited life span
22 of beer and intoxicating malt liquor, and due to the specific designated
23 geographic areas for the beer and other intoxicating malt liquor
24 wholesalers, which have been authorized by the brewers and approved
25 by the supervisor of alcohol and tobacco control.
