AN ACT

To repeal section 115.357, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to candidate filing fees.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 115.357, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 115.357, to read as follows:

115.357. 1. Except as provided in subsections 3 and 4 of this section, each candidate for federal, state, or county office shall, before filing [his] the declaration of candidacy, pay to the treasurer of the state or county committee of the political party upon whose ticket he **or she** seeks nomination a certain sum of money as follows:

6 (1) To the treasurer of the state central committee, [two hundred dollars] 7 ten percent of the salary for the office for which the candidate is 8 seeking nomination if he or she is a candidate for statewide office [or for], 9 United States senator, [one hundred dollars if he or she is a candidate for] 10 representative in Congress, circuit judge [or], state senator, [and fifty dollars if 11 he or she is a candidate for] or state representative;

12 (2) To the treasurer of the county central committee, fifty dollars if he or13 she is a candidate for county office.

2. The required sum may be submitted by the candidate to the official accepting [his] **the** declaration of candidacy. All sums so submitted shall be forwarded promptly by the official to the treasurer of the appropriate party committee.

3. Any person who cannot pay the fee required to file as a candidate mayhave the fee waived by filing a declaration of inability to pay and a petition with

20[his] the declaration of candidacy. Each such declaration shall be in 21substantially the following form: 22DECLARATION OF INABILITY TO PAY FILING FEE I, do hereby swear that I am financially unable to pay the fee of 2324(amount of fee) to file as a candidate for nomination to the office of at the primary election to be held on the day of, 20..... 2526..... Subscribed and sworn to before me this day of, 20.... . 27Signature of candidate 28..... Signature of election official or 29**Residence address** officer authorized to administer 30 31oaths 32If the candidate's declaration of candidacy is to be filed in person, the declaration of inability to pay shall be subscribed and sworn to by the candidate before the 33 34election official who witnesses the candidate's declaration of candidacy. If [his] the declaration of candidacy is to be filed by certified mail pursuant to subsection 35 36 2 of section 115.355, the declaration of inability to pay shall be subscribed and sworn to by the candidate before the notary or other officer who witnesses the 37 38candidate's declaration of candidacy. With his or her declaration of inability to pay, the candidate shall submit a petition endorsing his or her 39 40candidacy. Except for the number of signatures required, each such petition shall, insofar as practicable, be in the form provided in sections 115.321 and 41 42115.325. If the person filing declaration of indigence is to be a candidate for 43statewide office, [his] the petition shall be signed by the number of registered voters in the state equal to at least one-half of one percent of the total number 44 of votes cast in the state for the office at the last election in which a candidate 45ran for the office. If the person filing a declaration of indigence is to be a 46 candidate for any other office, the petition shall be signed by the number of 47registered voters in the district or political subdivision which is equal to at least 48 one percent of the total number of votes cast for the office at the last election in 49which a candidate ran for the office. The candidate's declaration of inability to 50pay and the petition shall be filed at the same time and in the same manner as 5152[his] **the** declaration of candidacy is filed. The petition shall be checked and its 53sufficiency determined in the same manner as new party and independent candidate petitions. 54

4. No filing fee shall be required of any person who proposes to be an

56 independent candidate, the candidate of a new party or a candidate for 57 presidential elector.

58 5. Except as provided in subsections 3 and 4 of this section, no candidate's 59 name shall be printed on any official ballot until the required fee has been paid.
