AN ACT

To amend chapter 620, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to grants to employers to encourage employees to obtain upskill credentials.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 620, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 620.2500, to read as follows:

620.2500. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:

(1) "Employee", any person employed by a qualifying employer or any person who is a prospective employee of a qualifying employer, provided such person is not an independent contractor;

(2) "Industry-recognized credential", a specific credential that is sought or accepted by employers within the industry or sector to which the qualifying employer belongs and that is a recognized, preferred, or required credential for recruitment, screening, hiring, retention, or advancement purposes within such industry or sector;

(3) "Public body", the state of Missouri, any department, division, commission, board, or political subdivision thereof;

(4) "Qualifying employer", any employer registered to do business in the state of Missouri provided the employer is not a public body;

(5) "Training provider", any entity that provides training in upskill credentials;

21 (6) "Technology-focused credential", a credential that
22 demonstrates the competencies necessary to succeed in an
23 occupation that utilizes technology to develop, build, and
24 deliver products and services;

25 (7) "Upskill credential", includes, but is not limited
26 to, any of the following:

27 (a) Industry-recognized credentials;

28 (b) Technology-focused credentials; and

29 (c) Any other credential indicated by a qualifying
30 employer as necessary for improving the skills of its
31 current and prospective employees.

32 2. The department of economic development may
33 distribute from the Upskill Credential Fund to any
34 qualifying employer a reimbursement not to exceed two
35 thousand dollars for each employee who obtains upskill
36 credentials, provided that no qualifying employer shall
37 receive more than thirty thousand dollars under this section
38 in any fiscal year. A qualifying employer shall submit an
39 application for an award for such reimbursement as provided
40 in this section in order to receive such funds.

41 3. The department of economic development shall design
42 an application form for qualifying employers to apply for an
43 award for reimbursement. The application form shall contain
44 all information that the department deems necessary to
45 fulfill the provisions of this section.

46 4. (1) The department of economic development shall
47 evaluate all applications submitted by qualifying employers
48 on a competitive basis using the following criteria:

49 (a) The pledged average wage increase that employees
50 or prospective employees will realize after obtaining the
51 upskill credential in relation to the cost of obtaining the
52 upskill credential;

53 (b) The level of economic distress in the qualifying
54 employer's region and the balance of awards made to the
55 various regions of the state; and

56 (c) The contribution made by the qualifying employer
57 toward the cost of obtaining the upskill credential.

58 (2) Applications shall be evaluated at the close of
59 the application period, as determined by the department, and
60 shall not be awarded on a first come, first served basis.
61 The department may make preliminary awards for reimbursement
62 only after the application period has closed.

63 (3) In making awards under this section, the
64 department shall distribute an equal number of awards to the
65 following groups of qualifying employers:

66 (a) Qualifying employers with at least one but not
67 more than fifty employees;

68 (b) Qualifying employers with at least fifty-one but
69 not more than two hundred employees; and

70 (c) Qualifying employers with more than two hundred
71 employees.

72 (4) Applications shall be considered during
73 application periods as determined by the department.

74 5. (1) Upon being given a preliminary award for
75 reimbursement under this section, each qualifying employer
76 shall sponsor a current or prospective employee to obtain an
77 upskill credential within twelve months of the preliminary
78 award. A current or prospective employee may not commence
79 the process of obtaining the upskill credential until after
80 a preliminary award has been made.

81 (2) Upon obtaining the upskill credential, the
82 qualifying employer shall submit proof of the same to the
83 department of economic development.

84 (3) To receive the reimbursement, the qualifying
85 employer shall provide to the department, within six weeks
86 of completing the upskill credential, proof, in the manner
87 requested by the department, that the individuals who
88 completed the upskill credential are Missouri residents with
89 a verifiable Missouri address.

90 (4) If the department is satisfied that the current or
91 prospective employee has obtained the upskill credential
92 based upon evidence provided pursuant to subdivision (2) of
93 this subsection and the provisions of subdivision (3) of
94 this subsection have been satisfied, the department shall
95 grant the qualifying employer the reimbursement indicated in
96 the preliminary award.

97 6. Training providers shall not be eligible for awards
98 issued under this section unless employees are trained by an
99 outside training provider.

100 7. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury
101 the "Upskill Credential Fund", which shall consist of money
102 appropriated to the fund by the general assembly, not to
103 exceed six million dollars in any fiscal year, and any funds
104 accepted from other sources, which shall not be limited in
105 any fiscal year. The state treasurer shall be custodian of
106 the fund and may approve disbursements from the fund in
107 accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180. Upon
108 appropriation, money in the fund shall be used solely for
109 the granting of funds to employers in the manner described
110 in this section.

111 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080
112 to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end
113 of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the
114 general revenue fund but shall remain in the Upskill
115 Credential Fund.

116 (3) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the
117 fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any
118 interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be
119 credited to the fund.

120 8. Pursuant to section 23.253 of the Missouri sunset
121 act:

122 (1) The provisions of this section shall sunset
123 automatically six years after the effective date of this
124 section unless reauthorized by an act of the general
125 assembly; and

126 (2) If such program is reauthorized, the program so
127 authorized shall sunset automatically twelve years after the
128 effective date of the reauthorization; and

129 (3) This section shall terminate on September first of
130 the calendar year immediately following the calendar year in
131 which the program so authorized is sunset.

132 9. The department may promulgate rules implementing
133 this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is
134 defined in section 536.010, that is created under the
135 authority delegated in this section shall become effective
136 only if it complies with and is subject to all of the
137 provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section
138 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and
139 if any of the powers vested with the general assembly
140 pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective
141 date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently
142 held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking
143 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28,
144 2023, shall be invalid and void.

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
