## AN ACT

To amend chapter 561, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the court disclosing certain consequences prior to accepting a guilty plea.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 561, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 561.029, to read as follows:

561.029. No defendant shall be permitted to plead guilty and no court shall accept a guilty plea from a defendant until the court has explained to the defendant the following:

- 4 (1) The maximum and minimum penalty provided by law for the 5 offense that may be imposed by the court;
- 6 (2) Any possible increased sentence by reason of the fact of a 7 prior conviction or future conviction and any possibility of the 8 imposition of consecutive sentences;
- 9 (3) Any registration requirement that accompanies the plea and the restrictions associated with the registration; and
- 11 (4) The consequences of the guilty plea on a defendant's ability 12 to:
- 13 (a) Retain or obtain housing in the public or private market;
- 14 (b) Acquire loans for educational or other purposes;
- 15 (c) Enroll in certain degree programs;
- 16 (d) Retain or obtain employment;
- 17 (e) Retain or obtain an occupational or driver's license;
- 18 **(f)** Possess a firearm;
- 19 (g) Remain in the country; and
- 20 (h) Retain or obtain custody of a child.
