## SENATE BILL NO. 58

## 101ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY

INTRODUCED BY SENATOR MAY.

## **AN ACT**

To repeal sections 115.277, 115.279, 115.283, and 115.291, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof five new sections relating to voting in elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 115.277, 115.279, 115.283, and

- 2 115.291, RSMo, are repealed and five new sections enacted in
- 3 lieu thereof, to be known as sections 115.274, 115.277, 115.279,
- 4 115.283, and 115.291, to read as follows:
  - 115.274. 1. Any registered voter of this state may
- 2 vote in advance of election day, without having to state an
- 3 excuse, in person or by mail for any general election as
- 4 follows:

- 5 (1) Early voting shall be conducted from the sixth
- 6 Tuesday before the election until 7:00 p.m. on the Monday
- 7 immediately before the election. The hours for conducting
- 8 early voting shall be the regular business hours of each
- 9 local election authority, provided that for the twenty-one
- 10 days immediately before election day, the hours shall also
- include from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday
- 12 and beginning on the Tuesday immediately before election day
- 13 through the Monday immediately before the election, the
- 14 hours shall be from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.;
- 15 (2) The local election authority shall establish early
- 16 voting locations as follows:

EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

- 17 (a) There shall be one early voting location for every
- 18 three precincts within the jurisdiction of the local
- 19 election authority, provided that there shall be at least
- 20 one early voting location within the jurisdiction of each
- 21 local election authority;
- 22 (b) Early voting locations shall be as centrally
- 23 located as is practicable; and
- 24 (c) In choosing early voting locations, the local
- 25 election authority shall consider the following factors:
- 26 a. The geographic location and demographics of voters
- in the previous federal general election;
- 28 b. Current United States census data;
- c. The availability of suitable satellite early voting
- 30 locations within the local election authority; and
- d. Any other factor deemed relevant by the local
- 32 election authority.
- 33 2. The local election authority shall provide adequate
- 34 public notice of the early voting locations by posting the
- 35 hours and locations for early voting at the local election
- 36 authority's office, on the local election authority's
- 37 website, and by other reasonable methods selected by the
- 38 local election authority.
- 39 3. The local election authority shall appoint at least
- 40 one election judge from each major political party to serve
- 41 at each early voting location. Procedures for selecting
- 42 election judges, designating election challengers, casting
- 43 ballots, and tabulating ballots shall be the same as
- 44 otherwise provided in this chapter.
- 4. Upon request by any person or entity, the election
- 46 authority or the secretary of state shall furnish media in
- 47 an electronic format or, if so requested, in a printed
- 48 format, showing the names, addresses, and voter

49 identification numbers of voters within the jurisdiction of

50 a specific election authority who voted pursuant to this

- 51 section.
  - 115.277. 1. Except as provided in subsections 2, 3,
- 2 4, and 5 of this section, any registered voter of this state
- 3 may vote by absentee ballot for all candidates and issues
- 4 for which such voter [would be] is eligible to vote at the
- 5 polling place [if such voter expects to be prevented from
- 6 going to the polls to vote on election day due to:
- 7 (1) Absence on election day from the jurisdiction of
- 8 the election authority in which such voter is registered to
- 9 vote;
- 10 (2) Incapacity or confinement due to illness or
- 11 physical disability, including a person who is primarily
- 12 responsible for the physical care of a person who is
- incapacitated or confined due to illness or disability;
- 14 (3) Religious belief or practice;
- 15 (4) Employment as an election authority, as a member
- 16 of an election authority, or by an election authority at a
- 17 location other than such voter's polling place;
- 18 (5) Incarceration, provided all qualifications for
- 19 voting are retained;
- 20 (6) Certified participation in the address
- 21 confidentiality program established under sections 589.660
- to 589.681 because of safety concerns; or
- 23 (7) For an election that occurs during the year 2020,
- 24 the voter has contracted or is in an at-risk category for
- 25 contracting or transmitting severe acute respiratory
- 26 syndrome coronavirus 2. This subdivision shall expire on
- 27 December 31, 2020].
- 28 2. Any covered voter who is eligible to register and
- vote in this state may vote in any election for federal

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office, statewide office, state legislative office, or statewide ballot initiatives by submitting a federal

32 postcard application to apply to vote by absentee ballot or

33 by submitting a federal postcard application at the polling

34 place even though the person is not registered. A federal

35 postcard application submitted by a covered voter pursuant

36 to this subsection shall also serve as a voter registration

37 application under section 115.908 and the election authority

38 shall, if satisfied that the applicant is entitled to

39 register, place the voter's name on the voter registration

40 file. Each covered voter may vote by absentee ballot or,

41 upon submitting an affidavit that the person is qualified to

42 vote in the election, may vote at the person's polling place.

- 3. Any interstate former resident may vote by absentee ballot for presidential and vice presidential electors.
- 4. Any intrastate new resident may vote by absentee
  46 ballot at the election for presidential and vice
  47 presidential electors, United States senator, representative
  48 in Congress, statewide elected officials and statewide
  49 questions, propositions and amendments from such resident's
  50 new jurisdiction of residence after registering to vote in
  51 such resident's new jurisdiction of residence.
  - 5. Any new resident may vote by absentee ballot for presidential and vice presidential electors after registering to vote in such resident's new jurisdiction of residence.
  - [6. For purposes of this section, the voters who are in an at-risk category for contracting or transmitting severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 are voters who:
    - (1) Are sixty-five years of age or older;

61 (2) Live in a long-term care facility licensed under 62 chapter 198;

- 63 (3) Have chronic lung disease or moderate to severe
  64 asthma:
- 65 (4) Have serious heart conditions;
- 66 (5) Are immunocompromised;
- 67 (6) Have diabetes;
- 68 (7) Have chronic kidney disease and are undergoing
- 69 dialysis; or
- 70 (8) Have liver disease.]
  - 115.279. 1. Application for an absentee ballot may be
- 2 made by the applicant in person, or by mail, or for the
- 3 applicant, in person, by his or her guardian or a relative
- 4 within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity. The
- 5 election authority shall accept applications by facsimile
- 6 transmission and by electronic mail within the limits of its
- 7 telecommunications capacity.
- 8 2. Each application shall be made to the election
- 9 authority of the jurisdiction in which the person is or
- 10 would be registered. Each application shall be in writing
- 11 and shall state the applicant's name, address at which he or
- 12 she is or would be registered, [his or her reason for voting
- 13 an absentee ballot] whether the applicant is incapacitated
- 14 or confined due to illness or physical disability or is a
- 15 person who is primarily responsible for the physical care of
- 16 a person who is incapacitated or confined due to illness or
- 17 physical disability, the address to which the ballot is to
- 18 be mailed, if mailing is requested, and for absent uniformed
- 19 services and overseas applicants, the applicant's email
- 20 address if electronic transmission is requested. If the
- 21 [reason for the applicant voting absentee is due to the
- 22 reasons established under subdivision (6) of subsection 1 of

23 section 115.277] applicant is a certified participant in the 24 address confidentiality program established under sections 25 589.660 to 589.681, the applicant shall state the voter's identification information provided by the address 26 27 confidentiality program in lieu of the applicant's name, address at which he or she is or would be registered, and 28 29 address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if mailing is 30 requested. Each application to vote in a primary election shall also state which ballot the applicant wishes to 31 32 receive. If any application fails to designate a ballot, the election authority shall, within three working days 33 after receiving the application, notify the applicant by 34 mail that it will be unable to deliver an absentee ballot 35 until the applicant designates which political party ballot 36 he or she wishes to receive. If the applicant does not 37 respond to the request for political party designation, the 38 election authority is authorized to provide the voter with 39 40 that part of the ballot for which no political party 41 designation is required. 42 [Except as provided in subsection 3 of section 43 115.281,] All applications for absentee ballots received prior to the sixth Tuesday before an election shall be 44 stored at the office of the election authority until such 45 time as the applications are processed in accordance with 46 section 115.281. No application for an absentee ballot 47 48 received in the office of the election authority by mail, by 49 facsimile transmission, by electronic mail, or by a quardian or relative after 5:00 p.m. on the second Wednesday 50 51 immediately prior to the election shall be accepted by any election authority. No application for an absentee ballot 52 submitted by the applicant in person after 5:00 p.m. on the 53

day before the election shall be accepted by any election

authority, except as provided in subsections 6, 8 and 9 of this section.

- 57 4. Each application for an absentee ballot shall be signed by the applicant or, if the application is made by a 58 59 quardian or relative pursuant to this section, the 60 application shall be signed by the guardian or relative, who 61 shall note on the application his or her relationship to the applicant. If an applicant, guardian or relative is blind, 62 unable to read or write the English language or physically 63 64 incapable of signing the application, he or she shall sign by mark, witnessed by the signature of an election official 65 or person of his or her own choosing. Any person who 66 knowingly makes, delivers or mails a fraudulent absentee 67 ballot application shall be guilty of a class one election 68 offense. 69
- 70 5. (1) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any
  71 resident of the state of Missouri who resides outside the
  72 boundaries of the United States or who is on active duty
  73 with the Armed Forces of the United States or members of
  74 their immediate family living with them may request an
  75 absentee ballot for both the primary and subsequent general
  76 election with one application.
- 77 (2) The election authority shall provide each absent 78 uniformed services voter and each overseas voter who submits 79 a voter registration application or an absentee ballot 80 request, if the election authority rejects the application 81 or request, with the reasons for the rejection.
- 82 (3) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, if 83 a standard oath regarding material misstatements of fact is 84 adopted for uniformed and overseas voters pursuant to the 85 Help America Vote Act of 2002, the election authority shall

86 accept such oath for voter registration, absentee ballot, or
87 other election-related materials.

- 88 Not later than sixty days after the date of each regularly scheduled general election for federal office, 89 90 each election authority which administered the election 91 shall submit to the secretary of state in a format 92 prescribed by the secretary a report on the combined number 93 of absentee ballots transmitted to, and returned by, absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters for the 94 95 election. The secretary shall submit to the Election Assistance Commission a combined report of such information 96 not later than ninety days after the date of each regularly 97 scheduled general election for federal office and in a 98 standardized format developed by the commission pursuant to 99 100 the Help America Vote Act of 2002. The secretary shall make the report available to the general public. 101
- 102 (5) As used in this section, the terms "absent uniformed services voter" and "overseas voter" shall have the meaning prescribed in 52 U.S.C. Section 20310.
- An application for an absentee ballot by a new 105 resident shall be submitted in person by the applicant in 106 the office of the election authority in the election 107 jurisdiction in which such applicant resides. 108 109 application shall be received by the election authority no 110 later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election. 111 application shall be in the form of an affidavit, executed in duplicate in the presence of the election authority or 112 any authorized officer of the election authority, and in 113 substantially the following form: 114
